With the help of the supportive neighborhoods, Waverly Leisure Services has been fortunate to be able to install 2 public Pickleball courts in parks over the last few years. One court can be found in Prairie Park (North of Tumbleweed Dr. NE) and a second can be found in Rolling Meadows Park (1322 Robertson Rd.). Both courts are combined with a basketball court. The pickleball nets and a few extra paddles and balls are supplied in totes and can be easily set up and used by players.
