L. Staff Comments

• There are a lot of projects going on in town with a lot of dirt moving; staff is working with the parking lot contractor to move dirt at the Dog Park around the fence and staff is reviewing the idea of locking the park down until project is finished in June as considering the type of work needing to be done and how it effects the access area; the Economic Development Commission is working on a policy for residential development to be put on the Council agenda for May 18; Debbie Durham, Director of Iowa Economic Development Authority will in town on May 6 for a Young Women Entrepenuer Conference for the Wartburg College; Bill & Phil will be in Des Moines May 7 for the SMART Economic Development Conference, and May 13 will be the City of Waverly Employee Years of Service Luncheon where the City recognize employees who reach levels of 10, 20, 25, 30, 35 and 40 years of service and this year the City celebrates Scott Brown for 35 years, Stuart Menzel for 30 years, Captain Don Eggleston for 20 years, Carla Guyer and Alan Leerhoff both for 10 years of service.

M. City Council Comments

- City of Waverly has been labeled the number one place in Iowa for places to be for young families with factors of cost of living, education and quality of life being considered. Waverly Chamber of Commerce Board discussed MainStreet Iowa & Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA) and the current assessment of economics in Waverly including 68% housing stock in Waverly falls below the \$200,000 level and Waverly is a big footprint draw.
- Streets by soccer fields were moved around this afternoon so soccer traffic can access the north parking lot through the Eliasen Addition. If you have been using

3rd Street you will need to shift over and use 1st Street. Barricades at 5th Street and 7th Avenue NW were in place for asphalt patching.

• There were some utility conflicts regarding 2nd Avenue NW between 6th and 8th Streets with services being too high. Project will still proceed on time just not in order.

• Pedestrians crossing streets safely continues to be a problem. Education and law enforcement through ticket writing is still needed together with fresh paint for the crosswalks and possibly more No Right Turn on Red signs.

• Gentlemen of the Road Concert will be have a stage downtown in front of the 300 East Bremer Building in addition to the main stage at Wartburg College. Issues of still being discuss include: access to downtown, transportation, hours of wristbands and fencing. Interested bands and/or vendors need to contact Madison House Productions.

N. Mayor's Comments

• While staff is always careful not to endanger trees the ones in Kohlmann Park are potentially at risk during the storm sewer project. Thoughts and prayers to the Maud Wickham family in time of her death and to Mary Ackerman in her time of poor health.
