7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1904 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built before the World War I period. By the time the 1913 city directory was published, the address is listed as occupied by E.J. and Rose Kaufman. Newspaper listings for E.J. Kaufman between June 1902 and August 1903 suggest construction during this time frame. A construction date of ca. 1904 is consistent with public records for this property.

This 2-story frame house is an example of a Hipped Roof, 2-story house form known as the "American Four-Square" that became popular in lowa after the turn of the 20th century and continued to be built into the 1920s in Waverly. The house has a parged stone foundation with narrow wood clapboard siding and corner board trim. A low-pitched hipped roof on the main block has a hipped roof attic dormer on the front slope and moderate eaves lined by a wide cornice board and closely spaced dentils. A two-level front porch includes a flat-roofed section spanning the full width of the first level and an enclosed hipped roof section on the second level, both also lined by dentils. Narrow clapboard siding with no corner boards is used for the closed balustrade and skirting on the lower level and for the walls of the enclosed upper level section. On the lower level, the open porch has four square columns evenly spaced across the front with the wide entrance steps on the west end opposite the off-set entrance door and side-light. On the upper level, the south-facing room appears to have been built as a sleeping porch or sun room with five 1/1 double-hung windows. It is likely that the upper level was completed at the time of initial construction.

Fenestration throughout the house includes widely spaced single 1/1 double-hung windows of various sizes with more decorative sash on the front façade. On the first floor, a cottage window is located to the left of the entrance. It features a leaded glass design in the upper horizontal sash over the single square fixed sash. Further to the left, an angular bay window section has 1/1 double-hung units flanking a multi-light French door in the center opening.

A detached frame 1-story garage is located at the rear of the property northwest of the house. The building was constructed in 1927 according to Assessor records and is considered noncontributing because of modern day alterations.

Alterations: No major changes.

8. Significance

The Kaufman House at 626 1st Ave NW built in ca. 1903 is an early example of an American Four-Square house form in the Northwest Quadrant. The early use of this form may come from the fact that the owner was a real estate agent. Except for the use of the sleeping porch, it is typical of other Four-Square houses eventually built in the period leading up to World War I in this neighborhood. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as an individually eligible and contributing resource to the historic district under Criterion C.

E.J. Kaufmann and his wife Rose occupied this house beginning in ca. 1904. It was constructed during the previous two years according to newspaper accounts beginning with the *Bremer County Independent* reporting the completion of the foundation on 8/6/1903. E.J Kaufmann worked in real estate sales, which likely explains the multiple newspaper accounts of its development. According to the newspaper article on 8/6/1903 in the *Bremer County Independent*, it was built on the boundary line between the 2nd & 5th wards (N. Cherry St. or 7th St. NW). E.J. Kaufmann was also a co-owner with his brother Adolph in Kaufmann Brothers, a drug store, beginning in 1886 and continuing until 1892 when E.J. was bought out. In 1911, E.J. bought out his brother's interest in the drug store that operated as "Kaufmann and West" to maintain the family name. The Kaufmanns had three daughters residing at home according the 1913 city directory – Lillian who worked as an assistant librarian for the Waverly Public Library, and Irene and Adele, both not working in 1913.


