7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1908 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house is part of a group of concrete block houses built in Waverly between ca. 197 and 1925 by several local concrete block manufacturing and masonry companies. Bremer County Auditor records for property transfers show the parcel acquired in October 1912 by Mabel Knapp, wife of concrete block manufacturer Lloyd Knapp. The house was not listed in the 1913 city directory. In 1916, the property was sold to Martha Miller at which time its construction was likely completed as a project of Knapp's company, Perkins and Knapp. A newspaper account from April 15, 1915 suggests Mrs. J.M. Miller was connected to this house at that time. Telephone directories show Mrs. Martha Miller residing here in 1931. A construction date of 1915 is consistent with public records for this property.

This 1½-story concrete block house is an example of a Hipped Roof house. The house has rock-faced concrete block for the foundation and walls with dark red mortar and a flat finished watertable between the foundation and main floor. It has a low pitched hipped or pyramid roof with wide eaves clad in original tongue-and-groove boards and gabled wall dormers on all sides – centered on the front and off-center on the sides. The dormers have wide returning cornices and the dormer walls are clad in covecut wood shingles with a wide crown molding detail separating them from the block walls below.

A flat roofed porch spans the front façade with a matching concrete block foundation. Substantial battered piers are at the outer corners and matching pedestals flank the center entrance steps. Square wood columns are set on these pedestals and may not be original. The closed balustrade consists of poured concrete formed with a curved design on the upper edge and a slightly recessed panel below. The deck and front steps are also poured concrete. Fenestration throughout the house includes single 1/1 double-hung windows of various sizes with a single window set in each of the dormers and widely spaced along the sides. On the front façade, cottage windows with wide horizontal sash above large square sash below flank the center entrance. The original front door is retained and has tall panels below a twin row of eight small square lights. Basement windows are 2-light, horizontal sash.

The property retains a 1-story frame garage to the rear of the main house built in 1956 according to Assessor records. It has a front-gable roof, narrow wood clapboard siding, corner board trim, and garage doors facing east.

Alterations: no changes identified.

8. Significance

The Miller House at 709 1st Ave NW built in ca. 1915 is an example of a concrete block house using the Hipped Roof, 1 or 1½-story house form that shared elements of the Bungalow Style that was growing in popularity prior to World War I. This house is known to have been owned by Lloyd Knapp, co-founder of the McRoberts and Knapp cement products company in 1912 when this vacant lot was acquired by his wife Mabel Knapp. It is likely that its construction was undertaken as a model home prior to its sale in 1916 to Martha Miller. The property retains an intact double-bay garage from the mid-1950s. Both

the house and garage qualify for the National Register of Historic Places as contributing resources to the historic district under Criteria A and C while the house qualifies for listing individually as well.

This property was acquired by Mabel Knapp, wife of Lloyd Knapp, from Charles Alfred Nordstrand on October 2, 1912. Earlier that year Lloyd had partnered with Charles McRoberts to form "McRoberts and Knapp," cement products manufacturers. An article published on October 24, 1921 noted that the partnership would be making cement blocks in the basement of the Coddington & Laird Building (in the 100 block of West Bremer Ave. during the winter of 1912-1913. The address is still not listed in the 1913 city directory and therefore it is likely that the Miller House was constructed sometime after that and most likely before March 29, 1916 when the lot and presumably the house were sold to Martha Miller. Mrs. J.M. Miller was listed as having her new house completed in the 2nd ward on April 15, 1915 in the *Bremer County Independent*. By the time the 1924 telephone directory was published, 709 1st Ave. NW was occupied by Mrs. J.M. Miller. It continued in the name of Mrs. Martha Miller in the 1931 telephone directory. The exact relationship between these two listings (the same person - most likely - or mother-in-law/daughter-in-law, or sister-in-laws) has not been confirmed.




