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7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1903 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built from the 1880s through the 1920s. Property transfer records show this parcel acquired by John Eckstein in June 1898 and the 1899 city directory shows him residing at 603 W. Water Street (1st St NW). A construction date of ca. 1903 is consistent with public records for this property.

This 2-story frame house is an example of a vernacular Gable-Front-and-Wing house form. The house has a concrete block foundation with narrow clapboard-style vinyl siding on the walls. The steeply pitched cross-gable roof has shallow eaves and gabled wall dormers on the east façade of the north wing and the upper level of the south façade. A hipped roof 1-story addition is at the northwest corner of the house. An enclosed, shed-roofed porch fills the right-hand ell. It has matching siding and a concrete foundation. Fenestration throughout the house includes widely spaced, single 1/1 double-hung windows. The exception is a new by-pass window in the enclosed front porch.

A double-bay frame garage is located north of the house. It was originally built in 1999 according to Assessor records. It has a low-pitched side-gable roof with narrow clapboard-style vinyl siding on the walls.

Alterations: vinyl siding on house (undated); front porch enclosed (undated).

8. Significance

The John and Julia Eckstein House at 603 1st St NW was built in ca. 1903 as a retirement home for the Ecksteins and is an example of a vernacular Gable-Front-and-Wing house form. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C. The garage is considered noncontributing because of integrity issues.

John Eckstein acquired this lot in June 1898 from Charles Krause. By the time the 1899 city directory was published, he was listed as residing at this address. John and his wife Julia continued to be listed at this address in the 1913 city directory. In both cases, John was listed as "retired." John was born in 1840 and died in 1923. He and his wife Julia had six daughters and six sons before retiring to this house in ca. 1903. The couple is buried at St. Paul's Lutheran Cemetery in Washington Township. Sometime after 1913, the house was transferred to Katherine Geissendoerfer, a widow, who passed it to Fred "Fritz" Ochlschlager in 1922. Alma Ochlschlager in turn transferred the property to Adolph Hartman in 1932. Adolph died in 1935 and property passed to Wilhelmina Hartmann. She retained ownership until 1972 but appears to have lived elsewhere in the neighborhood..




