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#### 7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1923 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built from before World War I through the 1920s. The house is present on the 1927 Sanborn Fire Insurance Map dated April of that year. Having owned the lot since 1920, the property was transferred by Louise Mundfrom to Fred W. Nolte in March 1926. Neither buyer nor seller was listed in the 1926 telephone directory. A construction date of ca. 1925 is consistent with public records for this property.

This 1½-story frame house is an example of a Bungalow/Craftsman Style Side-Gabled Roof form. The house has rock-faced concrete block for the main building foundation and mottled reddish-brown brick-for the porch foundation. The walls are clad in wide clapboard-style aluminum siding. The broad, moderate-pitched side-gable roof has moderate wide eaves that are flared at the ends. A massive front-gabled porch, also with flared eaves, ties back into the front roof slope. It has a brick foundation, closed balustrade with concrete caps, aluminum sided tympanum, and brick piers at the outer corners. The centered entrance steps are slightly to the right of the offset front door that is flanked by multi-light sidelights and wood panels. The multi-light front door has a Craftsman Style geometric pattern.

Fenestration throughout the house also includes Craftsman Style openings. Two large cottage windows on each side of the front door have six vertical lights in the upper horizontal sash. On the secondary facades, windows include a mix of single, paired and grouped 5/1 double-hung units with tall vertical lights in the upper sash, also Craftsman Style configurations.

The property has two garages. The original ca. 1925 single-bay stucco-clad garage is located north of the house along the alley. It has a front-gable roof with narrow eaves, 4/4 double-hung windows, and the opening at the east end. A second double-bay garage built in 1970 according to Assessor records has a broad front-gable roof and wide aluminum siding suggesting a date for the house's siding. This garage is located, northeast of the house along the alley.

Alterations: siding added (ca. 1970); garage (1970).

#### 8. Significance

The Fred and Alda Nolte House at 308 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave NW was built in ca. 1925 and is an example of a Craftsman Style Side-Gabled Roof Bungalow house form. By World War I the Harmon and LeValley Addition and the adjacent J.J. Smith Addition to the north along the Cedar River were largely developed. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C.

This property was transferred from Louise Mundfrom to Fred W. Nolte in March 1926, and to his wife Alda, three years later. The house first appears on Sanborn Maps in 1927 suggesting it was in place slightly before or after the transfer to Nolte. The 1931 telephone directory lists the Noltes at this address. In 1959, the property transferred from Alda Nolte to Herbert and Ruth Schwerin who had been residing here for some years. A familial relationship if any between Alda and Ruth is unknown.


