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#### 7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1932 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built during the 1920s and 1930s. Property transfer records show Cecelia Platte acquiring the parcel in December 1927. In 1932 Otto Platte transferred it to Cecelia & Margaret Mary Platte. The 1927 Sanborn map shows this address as vacant and by 1943, the house is in place. A newspaper account from July 1931 lists Otto Platte erecting a house on 2<sup>nd</sup> Street NW making 1932 a likely completion date for the building.

This 2-story frame house is an example of a Bungalow Style, Side-Gable Roof house form. The house has a rock-faced concrete block foundation with wide clapboard-style aluminum siding. A broad, moderate-pitched side-gable roof has large gable roof attic dormers on the front and rear roof slopes. The house originally had an open porch at the northeast corner as shown on the 1927 and 1943 Sanborn maps, but this was enclosed most likely at the time the house was sided. The porch also had a concrete block foundation. A fireplace or wood stove chamber and chimney clad in aluminum siding has been added to the south façade.

Fenestration throughout the house includes grouped, paired and single 1/1 double-hung windows of various sizes. On the first floor to the left of the entrance, a large 1/1 window is flanked by narrow 1/1 units windows. On the south façade, a shed roofed rectilinear oriel projects slightly from the wall and contains three narrow 1/1 double-hung units. A group of three smaller 1/1 windows are in the gabled dormers.

A detached frame 1-story garage is located at the rear of the property northwest of the house. It has a broad front gable roof, double-bay overhead door, beveled wood siding and corner board trim. The building was constructed in 1932 according to Assessor records but Sanborn maps suggest the original garage was only a single-bay building. The garage is considered noncontributing because of modern day alterations including the overhead door.

Alterations: siding (undated); porch enclosure (undated).

#### 8. Significance

The Otto and Cecelia Platte House at 309 2nd St NW built in ca. 1932 is an example of a Bungalow Style, Side-Gable Roof 2-story house form. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criterion C and the garage is considered noncontributing.

Property transfer records show Cecelia Platte acquiring this parcel on December 30, 1927. A newspaper account from July 1931 lists Otto Platte (husband of Cecelia Platte unknown) erecting a house on 2<sup>nd</sup> Street NW. The following year in 1932 Otto transferred ownership to Cecelia Platte (wife) and Margaret Mary (daughter) Platte. The deed was not recorded until 1941 and may have been related to Otto's entrance into military service (Otto's tombstone lists his service as a private in the U.S.

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Army during World War II). Otto was employed as a laborer doing various jobs including as a steel worker. Cecelia was a homemaker and seamstress.

In 1943 the house passed to O.C., a physician, and Olga Hardwig. They remained here until 1955 when the house was sold to Max and Hulda Poorman. Max operated an advertising specialty company and Hulda opened a beauty salon in the north front room of the house. In 1965 the house was transferred to Bill and Dorothy Westender who continued the beauty shop here. Bill was a city policeman and barber until he was elected sheriff and the couple was forced to relocate to the apartment in the courthouse. In 1973 they sold the property to Darrel and Ramona Whitney. Darrell worked as a farmer, welder and trucker and Ramona was a beautician. After 1984, Ramona became the sole owner until 1995 when she married Bill Strottman (owners of the house in 2012).




