7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1930 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built during the 1920s and 1930s. Property transfer records show H.H. Pape acquiring the parcel in March 1926 with no house on the parcel. The first telephone listing for Pape at this address was in 1931. The 1927 Sanborn map shows this address as vacant and by 1943, the house is in place. This public information makes it likely that ca. 1930 was the completion date for the building.

This 1½-story frame house is an example of a Bungalow/Craftsman Style, Side-Gable Roof house form. The house has a rock-faced concrete block foundation with narrow clapboard-style vinyl siding on the walls. A broad, moderate-pitched clipped side-gable roof has knee-brace brackets on the gable ends. The house has an open porch at the northwest corner with a clipped gable peak and vertical board trim. The closed balustrade and corner pedestals have matching narrow clapboard-style vinyl siding. Half-height battered paneled columns rest on the pedestals. The porch skirting has narrow vertical boards for the design.

Fenestration throughout the house includes grouped, paired and single 3/1 double-hung windows of various sizes. The vertical lights are a common design feature in Craftsman Style residences. On the west façade, a rectilinear bay window has a shed roof with three 3/1 double-hung windows. Square 3-light sash are on the second floor flanking a pair of 3/1 windows and a single horizontal 4-light sash is to the left of the bay window.

A detached frame 1-story garage is located at the southeast corner of the house. It has a broad front gable roof with a clipped peak, a pair of folding tongue-and-groove wood doors, beveled wood siding and corner board trim. The building was constructed in 1930 according to Assessor. The garage is considered noncontributing because of the lack of modern day alterations and the fact that it shares the house's clipped gable design.

Alterations: siding (undated).

8. Significance

The Henry and Agnes Pape House at 315 3rd Ave NW built in ca. 1930 is an example of a Bungalow Style, Clipped Side-Gable Roof 1½-story house form. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criterion C and the garage is considered contributing as well because it retains its original features and finishes.

Property transfer records show Henry H. Pape acquiring this parcel on March 1926. By the time the telephone directory was published the following May, Pape was still residing elsewhere. The 1931 phone book lists him residing here. His wife at the time was Agnes Selensky Pape.

In 1943 the house passed to Emma and William Scharnhorst. William died in 1948 but Emma continued to reside here selling the house to Paul and Janice Thurm in 1973.

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


