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7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1890 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with similar houses in Waverly built using this form from the 1880s to the 1910s. Property Transfer Records show this property held by Leighton Foster for some years prior to his death in 1901 when the property was transferred to Seth L. Foster. The1885 lowa Census shows Foster and his wife Clarissa residing at this address and the 1899 city directory shows L. Foster residing at 214 Linn St. (3rd St. NW), likely the same building. However, Sanborn maps for 1905 show a 2-story house while the 1915 map shows a 1½-story house. This is most likely the same house, however. If so, the house was built as a retirement home for the Fosters sometime before ca. 1885.

This house is an example of a vernacular Hipped Roof, 1-story house form. The house has a rock-faced concrete block foundation and the walls are clad in asbestos shingle siding. The house has a moderate pitched hipped roof with a flattened peak, narrow eaves, and broad, gabled wall dormers centered on each slope. A low-pitched hipped roofed porch spans most of the front façade with a low-pitched pediment above the centered entrance steps. Its tympanum has a curvilinear scroll-cut design. Four full-height turned posts are spaced across the front and with closely spaced turned spindles in the balustrades. The porch skirting retains a diagonal lattice pattern.

Fenestration for the house includes a mix of 1/1 double-hung windows sizes. The dormers have full-height 1/1 double-hung units and the side facades have tall and narrow 1/1 double-hung windows in singles and pairs. The windows on original front façade beneath the porch roof include a large four-light unit to either side of the off-set entrance.

The house has a 1-story, double-bay frame garage constructed at the rear along the east-west alley built in 1999. The garage has medium-width synthetic clapboard-style siding with a single-overhead door. The roof has a broad, low-pitched front gable roof facing 3rd St NW.

Alterations: Asbestos siding, undated; garage, 1999; new porch skirting, undated.

8. Significance

The Leighton and Clarissa Foster House at 216 3rd St NW was built in ca. 1885 and is an example of a vernacular Hipped Roof, 1-story house form. Leighton was a farmer and retired farmer during the family's occupancy of the house. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C.

Leighton Foster and his wife Clarissa occupied a house at this location by 1885 according to Iowa Census records. Originally listed as a farmer, ten years later Leighton was listed as a retired farmer, at age 85 and Clarissa was deceased.

In 1901 following Leighton Foster's death, the house was transferred to Seth Foster and then sold to Charles H. Russell. Russell had a construction business and eventually became a manufacturer of concrete blocks. He held the property until 1903 selling it to George Hirleman. The 1913 city directory

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shows Cora Hirleman, a worker at CaPhenin Chemical Co., and Carl Hirleman, a bookkeeper at the First National Bank residing here. They are believed to be siblings.

In 1918 the house was sold by George Hirleman to Leonora Garling. Telephone books list her residing here during the 1920s and 1930s. It remained her property until her death in 1982.

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
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
