### 7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1920 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built during the 1890s to 1920s. Property transfer records show the parcel was acquired by G.H. Korth in February 1920 from John Graening. A newspaper account from the *Bremer County Independent* on February 20, 1920 describes Korth's purchase of an existing house on N Linn St (3<sup>rd</sup> St NW) and plans to build one or two houses on it. Korth was a building contractor and likely built this house. He and his wife Mary resided at this address according to telephone directories until selling it in 1933. A construction date of 1920 is consistent with public records.

This large 2-story stucco house is an example of a vernacular Side-Gable, 2-story house form sometimes referred to as a "Center Gable House" because of the inclusion of a gable wall dormer centered on the front façade. Most examples of this style in Iowa date from the 1860s to the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. The Korth House has a rock-faced concrete block foundation with stucco walls; diagonal stickwork is in the tympanum of the broad, front-gabled screened porch. The moderate pitched side-gable roof has deep eaves with a centered wall dormer on the front façade. Knee-brace brackets are at the purlin points of the dormer and the end gables. The porch spans the full front façade with square, half-height concrete block columns with battered piers at the outer corners. The balustrade is closed with matching stucco cladding and a concrete-block foundation in lieu of skirting. A continuous row of 1/1 double-hung windows fills the space above the balustrade with the entrance at the center.

Fenestration throughout the house includes 1/1 double-hung windows of various sizes with a pair of windows in the front center gable dormer, second floor. Elsewhere, 1/1 units are asymmetrically placed on walls in order to accommodate internal room usage and staircases. The front door has a tall sash with geometric shaped lights.

A detached frame double-bay garage is located at the rear of the property east of the house. It has a broad, moderate-pitched front gable roof and a single-bay overhead door and service entrance facing 3<sup>rd</sup> St NW. It is clad in asbestos shingle siding (possibly original) with 4-light fixed sash windows. The building was constructed in 1940 according to Assessor records

Alterations: garage (1940).

#### 8. Significance

The Gustav and Mary Korth House at 316 3<sup>rd</sup> St NW built in 1920 is an example of a Side-Gable, 2-story house form popular from the 1860s through the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century known as a "Center-Gable House." The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criterion C. The garage is considered contributing because of its early construction and the retention of its integrity.

According to newspaper accounts, this house was one of two houses built on Lots 3 and 4 in Block 34, Harmon and LeValley's Addition after Gustav H. Korth acquired the "Houghton place" on 2/20/1920. Korth was a "builder of new houses" according to the 1920 Federal Census; he built this house for his

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wife, Mary, and family. A second house was planned but never built immediately north leaving the Houghton place there until it was razed in ca. 1993. The property was first sold separately from the original parcel, which included lots 3&4, on 5/3/1919 by W.E. Krumholz to John Graening for \$1250. John Graening then sold it to Gustav Korth, again for \$1250, on 2/11/1920. The Korths resided at 316 3<sup>rd</sup> St NW until they sold the property to Emma Beck on 10/30/1933 for \$4200. Emma held the property until 1950 when she transferred it to Friendship Haven, Inc.




