#### 7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1924 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built before and after World War I. The house appears to be one of several built in the early decades of the 20<sup>th</sup> century by members of the Blain family, owners of the Blain Cement Co. S.E. Blain and Annis Blain owned all of Lots 3 and 4 in Block 6 in November 1918. Blain and his family resided across the street at 623 3<sup>rd</sup> St NW and he also owned a rental property at 617 3<sup>rd</sup> St NW until 1920. If this house was completed in 1924, it was likely used as a rental prior to being transferred to Myrtle Osterholm in 1941 by Annis Blain's estate. S.E. Blain was listed in at least one newspaper account of 1925 as having completed a "pebble dash" stucco barn confirming his work in stucco during the early to mid 1920s. The construction date of ca. 1924 appears to be consistent with other public records for this property.

This 2-story concrete block and stucco dwelling is an example of a vernacular Front-Gabled Roof house form. The Osterholm House has a rock-faced concrete block foundation built using Blain Cement Co. block with stucco walls. The house is one of a pair of nearly identical houses constructed next to one another on 3<sup>rd</sup> Street NW that are attributed to Seth E. Blain. The house has a moderate-pitched front-gabled roof with medium-width eaves, wide cornice boards and no dormers. The low-pitched hipped roof enclosed porch extends across the full front with the entrance steps at the south end. The porch has a matching concrete block foundation with the top row a short-height version of the main block used. The porch was originally unenclosed with a stucco clad balustrade and battered piers at the outer corners. At an unknown date the walls above the balustrade were enclosed with contiguous 1/1 double-hung windows. A side-gable1-story addition with narrow clapboard-style siding is located on the north side of the house set back from the front façade.

Fenestration includes widely spaced 1/1 double-hung windows of several sizes on primary and secondary facades. The porch entrance is flanked by narrower 1/1 sash. A second entrance is located along the south facade. Windows in the north addition are shorter 1/1 double-hung units.

A detached single-bay frame garage is located south of the house. It has a moderate-pitched front-gable roof with a single replacement overhead door in the gable end. It is clad in matching stucco finish and was constructed in 1924 according to Assessor records.

Alterations: infill porch windows and wall enclosure, undated.

#### 8. Significance

The Myrtle Osterholm House at 618 3<sup>rd</sup> St NW was built in ca. 1924 and is an example of a vernacular Front-Gabled Roof house form. Its construction and that of an identical house to the south are attributed to Seth E. Blain who was related to George Blain, owner of the local concrete block factory and concrete block contractor. S.E. Blain resided across the street where he built two other concrete block houses. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C.

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According to property transfer records, S.E. Blain sold this house to his wife Annis Blain in 1938. It remained in her name until 1941 when her estate transferred it to Myrtle Osterholm, possibly a niece or grand-daughter. Myrtle Osterholm continued to own the property until 1950 when it was transferred to Fred Osterholm. It passed out of the Osterholm family in 1962 with a transfer to Ronald and Mary Louise Homann.

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
