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7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1955 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built during the 1950s and 1960s. Property transfer records show that Edwin and Rachel Kohlmann acquired this property on September 28, 1953 from Arla Brula Bartling. An earlier house on the site was offered for sale and removal in an advertisement in the *Bremer County* Independent on May 25, 1955. The first time the Kohlmanns were listed as residing at this address was in the 1957 telephone book. Together these sources confirm a construction date of ca.1956.

This combination 1 and 1½-story frame house is an example of a variation of the Ranch/Rambler house form. A 1-story double-bay garage is attached at north end and the mid-section of the house has a second level set beneath a large shed roof attic dormer on the east slope. The balance of the house is 1-story in height. The house is oriented diagonally on the parcel with the long, horizontal side facing the Cedar River. The long horizontal form is divided into three sections of different heights, each topped by a broad side-gable roof with moderate wide eaves; the south section has no eaves along the gable end. The main entrance is set in the ell located along the west side formed by the adjoining south and middle sections. The Kohlmann House has a concrete block foundation with a combination of limestone veneer and wide wood clapboard siding on the walls. The limestone wraps the southwest corner of the house and the stone is repeated in the massive partially exposed fireplace/chimney on the east side of the house. A low-pitched shed roofed porch/sun room extends from the main house on the west side overlooking the Cedar River.

Fenestration throughout the house includes a mix of tall and narrow casement and fixed light windows with either six or eight lights clustered in groups of three and five. In one area facing the river, a group of four single-light vertical sash may be original or a replacement of the original multi-light windows. A panel of glass block fills an opening adjacent to the entrance. The 1/1 windows in the porch/sun-room have operable awning sash in the lower haves.

An attached double-bay garage with a low-pitched hipped roof is at the south end. It is clad in the same finishes as the house. It retains its original wood and glass paneled overhead door with a passage door along the south wall. It was constructed in 1958 when the balance of the house was built according to Assessor.

Alterations: casement window installation, undated; possible porch addition, undated.

8. Significance

The Edwin and Rachel Kohlmann House at 92 4th Ave NW was built in 1956 and is a well-preserved example of a variation of the Ranch/Rambler house form to fit an unusual parcel and vista. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C.

According to property transfer records, Edwin and Rachel Kohlmann acquired this property on June September 28, 1953 from Arla Brula Bartling. Telephone directories for 1957 show the Kohlmann

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family in residence and by 1961, the first city directory listing for the property shows Edwin and Rachel as the owners and operators of Kohlmann's Clothing Store until 1973. The couple continued to reside here in retirement. Edwin died in 1989 and Rachel and 1996. The Kohlmann family's clothing store had operated in Waverly since 1900 beginning first as a tailoring shop.


