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7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1870 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built from the 1860s to the 1920s. The property was transferred from the administrator of the William P. Harmon Estate to Charles Wellsman on December 31, 1868. Wellsman and his wife Elizabeth held the property until 1908 during which time they are recorded in the 1885 lowa Census as residing at this property. The 1868 bird's-eye view map shows a different 1-story house on this lot at the corner of 1st St and 4th Ave NW. The house was likely built sometime soon after the 1868 acquisition by the Wellsmans making the ca. 1870 date consistent with public records.

This brick dwelling is an example of a vernacular Gable-Front and Wing house form with the front-gable section containing two stories and the east wing 1-story in height. The original house sections have a parged stone foundation with solid-color, soft red brick for the walls. The 2-story front-gable section has a moderate-pitched roof with wide eaves and the 1-story side-gable east wing has a similar pitch with an exposed chimney (later addition) on the east wall. A later front-gable frame entrance addition was tucked in the right hand ell likely in 1970 when the garage addition was constructed. The entrance addition has synthetic clapboard siding with tall 1/1 double-hung windows closely spaced on three sides.

Window openings in the brick sections of the house have segmental arches constructed of a double row of brick and a row of header brick for the sills. Window units are 1/1 double-hung sash, likely replacements of earlier multi-light sash. Fenestration includes a widely spaced 1/1 double-hung windows of various sizes. There are no feature windows.

An attached single-bay frame garage is located on the north side of the house where it opens onto 1st St NW. It is clad in wood clapboard siding and was constructed in 1970 according to Assessor records.

Alterations: entrance addition, ca. 1970; garage, 1970.

8. Significance

The Wellsman House at 96 4th Ave NW was built in ca. 1870 and is an example of a vernacular Gable-Front and Wing house form. The house is among the oldest in the neighborhood and qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C.

According to property transfer records, the estate of William Harmon transferred this property December 31, 1868 to Charles Wellsman. The 1868 bird's-eye view map confirms that another house was present then and that the 2-story brick house had not yet been built at Fremont and Water streets. By 1885, Charles and his wife Elizabeth were residing at this address according to the 1885 lowa Census. Their daughter, Mary, age 23, was also residing at home. Charles was employed as a butcher and Elizabeth kept house. In 1899, Charles died but Elizabeth continued to hold onto the house until 1908 when she sold the house to James Mellinger. He and his wife held the property until

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November 1925 when it was sold to Lena Schucknecht. She held the property until 1941 when she had married and become Lena Sohle. She transferred it to Wayne and Rosalyn Schucknecht, familial relationship unknown. They resold it the same year to Theodore and Viola Drape who transferred it the following year, 1942, to Elsie Pothast. Property transfer records are unclear after that date.

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
