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7. Description

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This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1925 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built during the World War I period. A house at this address appears in the 1913 city directory listings two occupants, most likely occupying an earlier house. The 1915 Sanborn Map shows an earlier 1-story house on this lot. The lot was transferred by Carl Bohn to Ernest Brandt in March 1916. The *Bremer County Independent* published an account of Brandt's construction of a house in the 2nd Ward on 3/23/1916. A construction date of ca. 1916 appears to be more accurate.

This 2-story frame house is an example of a Hipped Roof, 2-story house form known as the "American Four-Square" that became popular in Iowa prior to World War I and continued to be built into the 1920s. The house has a rock-faced concrete block and gray-colored brick foundation with narrow clapboard-style steel siding and narrow cornerboards. A large 1-story addition is located on the west side of the house diminishing its integrity. A moderate-pitched hipped roof has a hipped roof attic dormer on the front slope. The enclosed front porch spans the full front and extends along the south façade of the addition. Walls have been enclosed in both sections with steel siding and a mix of single-light casement windows widely spaced and 1/1 double-hung units. The entrance is centered on the main house. Fenestration throughout the balance of the house includes widely spaced single 1/1 double-hung windows.

A detached 1-story frame garage is located at the rear of the property where it opens onto 3^{rd} Street NW. It has a single-bay with a low-pitched front-gable roof and matching narrow steel siding. The garage was built in 1948 according to Assessor records. A second detached 1-story frame garage is located west of the house. It has a side-gable roof with a wide foot print that incorporates a single bay and a combined double-bay with additional storage in one end. The building measures 32 x 48 feet and has matching narrow steel siding. It was erected in 1990 on a separate lot to the west of the Brandt House.

Alterations: steel siding (undated); west addition (undated); porch enclosure (undated); new garage (1990) and garage remodeling (undated).

8. Significance

The Ernest and Margaretha Brandt House at 302 4th Ave NW built in ca. 1916 is an example of an American Four-Square house form from the post-World War I period. It is typical of several other Four-Square houses built as in-fill housing during the years before and after the war in this neighborhood. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criterion C but the dwellings two garages are considered noncontributing because of integrity and construction date issues.

Carl Bohn sold this lot to Ernest Brandt in March 1916 with an older 1-story house on the lot. The *Bremer County Independent* published an account of Brandt's acquisition and construction of a new house in the 2nd Ward on 3/23/1916. It is unclear whether Ernest and his wife Margaretha ever resided

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here. Many Brandt families resided on farms in Jefferson Township or in Denver, also in Jefferson Township. It is most likely that the house was held for rental use and investment purposes.

Ernest Brandt died in 1928 but his widow held onto the house for two more decades. The house was transferred by Margaretha Brandt in 1947 to Henry and Meta Brandt, likely Ernest and Margaretha's son and daughter-in-law. Henry's estate passed the house to Meta in 1974 and she sold it to Gary Erwin and Janis Matthias in 1982. The couple continues as owners of the property in 2013.




