### 7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1905 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built from the 1890s through the 1920s. The property was transferred from Margaret Young, resident to the north, to Aldia Nolte in 1905. The property was transferred four years later to Mary Willis and her husband Albert. Given this information it is likely that the house was built by either the Nolte family or the Willis family between 1905 and 1909. In the 1913 city directory, the Willis family resided at this address.

This frame dwelling is an example of a vernacular Front-Gabled Roof 1½-story house form. The Nolte-Willis House has a rock-faced concrete block foundation with narrow clapboard-style steel siding on the walls and vertical board-and-batten style steel siding in the gable peaks. The house has a steeply-pitched front-gable roof with hipped roof wall dormers centered on the north and south slopes. A flat-roofed porch extends across the full front and is now enclosed. The porch has the balustrade clad in matching vinyl siding with a continuous row of 1/1 windows in the upper walls. The porch entrance door is located opposite the house's original front door. An uncovered wood deck is located on the south side of the house.

Window openings in the main house include a shallow angular bay window on the second level of the front façade beneath the gable peak. On the first floor inside the enclosed porch, cottage windows with narrow horizontal upper sash over large square lower sash, are located to either side of the centered entrance door. Elsewhere, 1/1 double-hung window units are of various sizes in singles and pairs.

A detached 2-story side-gabled frame carriage barn is located along the rear property line west of the house perpendicular to the alley. It was originally built without the shed-roofed step-out designed to handle the size of automobiles. It has beveled wood siding and corner board trim with a by-pass door made of tongue-and-groove vertical boards in the step out addition as well as an overhead door. It was undated according to Assessor records.

Alterations: siding, undated; porch enclosure, undated.

### 8. Significance

The Nolte-Willis House at 211 4<sup>th</sup> St NW was built in ca. 1911 and is an example vernacular Pyramidal or Hipped Roof 1½-story house form. The form features five gabled wall and attic dormers. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C.

According to property transfer records, the property was transferred from Margaret Young, the owner/resident of the house to the north, to Aldia Nolte in 1905. The property was transferred four years later to Mary Willis and her husband Albert. Sometime in between the house was likely built. The Willis family occupied the house in the 1913 city directory. At that time Albert was not employed but their Mary and Albert's daughter, Ida, worked at the Waterloo Skirt & Garment Co. above 301 E. Bremer Ave in the downtown. Mary Willis' estate transferred the property to Grace Young in 1935.

She and her husband Arben, an attorney, resided here at least until the 1950s. Grace sold it in 1982 to Kurt and Anna Meyer. Follower her husband's death in 1985, Anna held it until 1991 selling it to Dennis and Cynthia Oleson. They transferred it the same year to James and Tammy Marie Dickinson who remain the owners in 2013.


