7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1888 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built from the 1880s through the 1910s. The property was transferred from Mary Dailey and husband in 1892 to William Smith. A house with a similar footprint appears on the 1894 Sanborn Map. William Smith was not documented as residing here in the 1899 city directory or the 1895 lowa State Census, however. The first couple to be documented as residing here was Ruth and John Morris following their purchase of the house in December 1912. Given this information it is likely that the house was built in ca. 1894 or a few years earlier.

This frame dwelling is an example of a Gable-Front and Wing 2-story house form. The Morris House has a smooth finished concrete block foundation that suggests the house was elevated on to a new foundation some years after construction. The walls are clad in asbestos shingle siding. The house has a moderate-pitched, intersecting gable roof with moderate width eaves and a gabled wall dormer on the front slope of the south wing. A shed-roofed porch fills the left hand ell. The porch construction was modified when the new foundation was installed resulting in the installation of a block foundation and concrete deck for the porch with wrought iron posts for roof supports and a decorative wrought iron balustrade in place of the previous wood trim elements. Window openings in the main house include widely spaced single and paired 1/1 double-hung window units.

A detached 1-story front-gabled frame garage is located at the rear opening on to 3rd Ave NW. It has a double-bay width with wide clapboard-style siding on the walls and channel-cut siding in the gable ends. The front of the garage extends forward supported by angled braces. According to Assessor records it was built in 1976.

Alterations: foundation replacement and elevation; asbestos siding, undated; porch modifications, undated; garage, 1976.

8. Significance

The John and Ruth Morris House at 323 4th St NW was built in ca. 1894 and is an example vernacular Gable-Front and Wing 2-story house form. A number of similar forms were built in the same neighborhood during the 1890s, each featuring a gabled wall dormer on the side-gabled wing. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C.

According to property transfer records, the property was transferred from Mary Dailey and her husband in 1892 to William Smith. A house with a similar footprint appears on the 1894 Sanborn Map dating this house's construction before that date. Although William Smith held the house until1901, he was not documented as residing here in the 1899 city directory or the 1895 lowa State Census. Eliza Laird purchased the house in 1901 and held it until 1912. The first couple to be documented as owners residing here was Ruth and John Morris following their purchase of the house in December 1912. The 1913 city directory lists them here but with neither Ruth or John employed. In 1920 the house was

transferred to Henry Raecker. He and his wife Antonia held the house until 1924 when it was sold to John Piersdorf and his wife Sophia. She sold it in 1935 to Martha Hay who transferred it with her husband in 1943 to Renetta Meier. The house changed hands frequently following World War II – to John and Edna Burman in 1945, to Carl Oetting in 1946, and to Wilhelminia Sweet in 1948. It is presumed that the house was being used for rental purposes.


