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7. Description

This house is estimated to have been built in 1888 according to Bremer County Assessor records. This date is consistent with similar house forms built between the 1890s and 1910s. A newspaper from October 11, 1894 identifies Peter Woodring as building a house in the 2nd Ward on the lot he bought from Darwin Leet. Woodring had acquired Lot 2 from Leet in September 1894 and held it until May 1895 when it was sold to Mary Roloff. The 1899 city directory lists her as residing at 514 N. Locust St (4th St NW). A more accurate date for the house based on this information would be ca. 1895.

This 1-story frame dwelling is an example of a vernacular Pyramidal or Hipped Roof house form. The Roloff House has a parged foundation with narrow-width clapboard-style vinyl siding on the walls. The house has a steeply-pitched hipped roof with narrow eaves and a single gabled roof attic dormer on the north side slope. The original windows appear to have been paired 1/1 double-hung but most of the units have been replaced with single casement and fixed sash or hopper sash. The house currently has no porch.

A detached double-bay frame garage is located east of the house opening on to 5th Ave NW. It has a low-pitched hipped roof with a replacement overhead door. A screened porch extends along the west side of the garage. It was constructed in 1923 according to Assessor records and has clapboard-style vinyl siding.

Alterations: siding, undated; window replacements, undated; likely front porch removal, undated.

8. Significance

The Mary Roloff House at 522 4th St NW is an example of an example of a vernacular Pyramidal or Hipped Roof house form. The house was built during the decade of the 1890s, the decade that Waverly saw the greatest growth by percentage in population. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the Harmon and LeValley NW Historic District under Criteria A and C and the garage is considered noncontributing.

According to property transfer records, Peter Woodring owned this property between September 1894 and May 1895 when it was sold to Mary Roloff. A newspaper account from the *Bremer County Independent*, 10/11/1894 identifies Peter Woodring as "commencing building a new house on the lots he bought from Darwin Leet in the Second Ward." Woodring first purchased Lot 20 on September 3, 1924 from Leet and had eight months to complete its construction before selling it to Mary Roloff. By the time the 1899 city directory was published, Mary Roloff was listed as residing at 514 N. Locust St (4th St NW). It is likely that this house was the same one built by Woodring. Mary Roloff was listed in the 1899 directory as a widow and Emma Roloff was listed at the same address working as a dressmaker.

In 1901, Mary Roloff sold the house to Peter Dalton and his wife Sarah, a retired couple. By the time the 1913 city directory was published, Peter had died and Mary resided here as a widow. She sold the house the same year to Alvina Holm and her husband, Herman, who worked at the Waverly Brewing

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Co. They held the house until 1919 when it was sold to H.A. Murray, a real estate agent, who passed it to Louis Gabe a short time later.

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
