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#### 7. Description

This house is estimated to have been built in 1908 according to Bremer County Assessor records. This date is consistent with similar house forms built between the 1900 and the 1920s. The house does not appear in the 1899 city directory but by 1913 was listed under an individual who does not appear in property transfer records and was likely a tenant. The property was held by Charles and/or Tillie Hanker from 1905 until 1920, though Tillie, a widow, was not listed in the 1913 city directory as occupy. The ca.1908 Assessor date is feasible for construction of this house though remains unconfirmed.

This 1-story frame dwelling is an example of a Craftsman Style house built using a Pyramidal or Hipped Roof form. The Hanker House has an L-shaped plan with a rock-faced concrete block foundation, narrow-width wood clapboard siding on the walls, a wide cornice board, and cornerboard trim. The house has a low-pitched hipped roof with narrow eaves and no attic dormers. A flat-roofed open porch spans the front façade. Narrow battered piers support the roof and rest on a closed, clapboard-clad balustrade that extends to the ground level. The house's original windows and front door are the most distinctive features of this house's design. The double-hung window units have a crown molding on the upper trim board with a Craftsman Style geometric pattern of rectangular lights in the upper sash. This pattern is used for tall single windows flanking the entrance, widely spaced single windows on the north façade, and both single and paired windows on the south façade. Paired window units are found in the shallow hipped roof rectilinear bay. Some of the window units have Craftsman Style window boxes with raised molding matching the patterns of the windows. The basement level windows have been replaced with glass block infill.

Two detached frame garages open onto 5<sup>th</sup> Ave NW. The oldest contributing garage was built in ca. 1910 according to Assessor records. It has a front-gable roof with a low pitch, single bay, beveled wood siding, vertical tongue-and-groove hinged garage doors, and square, four-light windows with matching Craftsman Style window boxes along the sides. The second noncontributing frame garage was constructed in 1975 according to Assessor records. It has a broad low-pitched front-gable roof, two bays with separate overhead doors, and wide clapboard-style synthetic siding.

Alterations: garage siding, undated; glass block basement window replacements, undated.

#### 8. Significance

The Hankner House at 523 4<sup>th</sup> St NW is a well-preserved example of a Craftsman Style house that uses a Pyramidal or Hipped Roof form. The house was built in ca. 1908 and the contributing garage a few years later. Both qualify for the National Register of Historic Places individually and as contributing resources to the Harmon and LeValley NW Historic District under Criteria A and C. The second garage is considered noncontributing.

According to property transfer records, Tillie and Charles Hankner acquired this property in November 1903. Charles died a few years later and Tillie continued to own the property until 1920. During that time period, she is listed in the 1913 city directory at another address while the dwelling at 523 4<sup>th</sup> St NW was occupied by Clarence Wilcox, an engineer. In 1920 Tillie Hanker, now a widow, sold the

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property to Floyd Blain who held it for about a year. He transferred it to William Martin in 1921. William and his wife resided at this address according to telephone directories during the 1920s and 1930s not transferring the house until 1940 when the couple sold it to Bertha Propp.






