### 7. Description

This house is estimated to have been built in 1900 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The design of the house is at least ten years later than this date. Property transfers and city directory listings tell the story of ownership and occupancy pointing to a ca. 1912 year of construction. The house was acquired by Dietrich Scharnhorst in 1911 and the 1913 city directory shows Ernest Fuhrmann and his wife Ida (probably Scharnhorst by birth) at this address. In 1920 transfer records show the property passing from Scharnhorst to Ida Fuhrmann. It remained in the Fuhrmann family until 1920 when it passed back to members of the Scharnhorst family. Construction of the house is consistent with a later date of construction, ca. 1912.

This 2-story frame dwelling is an example of a Tudor Revival Cottage with a Front-Gabled Roof house form. The house has a rock-faced concrete block foundation, narrow wood clapboard siding on the first floor and stucco-clad walls with geometric patterned half-timbering on the second floor and attic level above a wide horizontal belt course. The moderate-pitched front-gabled roof has wide flared eaves with exposed rafter tails and shed-roofed wall dormers on the north and south slopes. A small porch with a front-gabled roof is at the south corner of the front façade. Its flared roof, wide eaves lined with exposed rafters, stucco gable finish, diagonal half-timbering and clapboard cladding on the closed balustrade match the finishes of the main house. Short battered piers rest on tall clapboard pedestals at the outer corners of the porch and a block foundation also matches that of the house. The only change in the porch is its enclosure through the use of infill 1/1 windows above the balustrade and narrow wood infill panels.

The house's original 1/1 double-hung windows remain in place in widely spaced singles and pairs. Each of the wall dormers has a pair of tall 1/1 double-hung units with the dormer on the south façade also incorporating a door that leads to a small roof-top balcony located above the 1-story wing set back along the wall. The original roof-top balustrade has been replaced with a span of widely spaced square spindles. The first floor room beneath the roof balcony serves as an entrance to the rear service areas of the house with a continuous row of short by-pass sliding windows placed high on the wall.

A single detached hipped roof frame garage is located parallel to the alley with the overhead door facing west. Built at the time the house was constructed according to Assessor records, it has been modified with the installation of a new overhead door. The balance of the garage including its wide beveled siding, and exposed rafter tails along the eaves retain the building's integrity.

Alterations: garage door, undated; porch enclosure, undated; roof-top balustrade changes, unchanged.

### 8. Significance

The Ernest and Ida Fuhrmann House at 616 4<sup>th</sup> St NW is an example of a Tudor Revival Cottage with a Front-Gabled Roof house form. The house was likely built in ca. 1912 while owned by Dietrich Sharnhorst, perhaps Ida's father or another relative. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as contributing resource to the Harmon and LeValley NW Historic District under Criteria A and C. The garage is considered contributing.

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According to property transfer records, Dietrich Scharnhorst held this property beginning in 1911 when he acquired it from Carl Bohn. By 1913, published city directory listings show Ernest Fuhrmann and his wife Ida (probably Scharnhorst by birth) residing at this address. In 1920 transfer records show the property passing from Scharnhorst to Ida Fuhrmann. Ernest was employed as a machinist for the Iowa Sugar Company. The house remained in the Fuhrmann family until 1945 when it passed back to members of the Scharnhorst family. The same year it was sold through a series of heirs ending up in the hands of Glenn Eggleston in July 1946. Five years later he passed it to Hazel, Vera, Frances and May Eggleston. A descendent of the family, Lois Eggleston, continues to own and reside in the house in 2013.




