#### 7. Description

This house is estimated to have been built in 1893 according to Bremer County Assessor records. Lots 1 and 2 in Block 42 were transferred from Jennie Case and her husband to Charles H. Barrows in February 1892. During the next two years, Barrows was listed in separate newspaper accounts in conjunction with the construction of a house in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Ward that most likely built on the north half of these lots. The 1894 Sanborn Map shows a house on the north half and no building on the south half. In October 1899, Barrows sold the south half to S.H. Kingsley, a mason, and it is believed the house was erected either by Barrows between 1894 and 1899 or by Kingsley during 1899-1900. In September 1900 the property was sold to John Beck who held it until 1919 and rented it during part of that time to Will Homann. Homann bought it in 1920 becoming the first owner-occupant. A construction completion date of after 1894 and before 1899 during Barrows ownership is consistent with the plan and materials.

This 2-story frame dwelling is an example of a vernacular Gable-Front and Wing house form with an L-shaped plan. The house has a stone foundation with medium-width clapboard siding and cornerboard trim on the walls. The moderate-pitched intersecting gable roof has narrow eaves and no dormers. Hipped roof porch is tucked in the left-hand ell. The balustrade has slightly narrower clapboard finish that extends to ground level and the section above the railing is covered with plastic sheeting. Fenestration includes widely spaced single 1/1 double-hung window units with 2/2 storm sash.

A wide, single-bay detached frame garage is located parallel to the alley with the overhead door facing east. The garage was built in 1920 according to the Assessor estimate. It has medium-width wood clapboard siding, a broad front-gable roof, and an early overhead door. The garage form suggests a later construction date than the Assessor estimate.

Alterations: porch boarding, undated.

#### 8. Significance

The Will F. and Louise Homann House at 617 4<sup>th</sup> St NW is an example of a vernacular Gable-Front and Wing house form. The house was likely built between 1895 and 1900. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource in the Harmon and LeValley NW Historic District under Criteria A and C. The garage is considered noncontributing.

According to property transfer records, Lots 1 and 2 in Block 42 were transferred from Jennie Case and her husband to Charles H. Barrows in February 1892. Jennie owned all of the block at the time. During the next two years, Barrows was listed in separate newspaper accounts in conjunction with the construction of a house in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Ward that most likely was built on the north half of these lots. The year-end summary for 1893 (March 28, 1893, p. 1) indicates that C.H. Barrows built a house for \$1,000. A building also appears on the 1894 Sanborn on the north half with no building completed on the south half yet. In October 1899, Barrows sold the south half to S.H. Kingsley, a mason, and it is believed the house was erected either by Barrows between 1894 and 1899 or by Kingsley during 1899-1900.

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Neither Barrows nor Kingsley resided at this address in the 1899 city directory. In September 1900 the property was sold by Kingsley to John Beck who held it until 1919 and rented it during part of that time to Will Homann. Will and his wife Louise resided here in the 1913 city directory when Will was employed for the Waverly Brewing Company. In 1920, transfer records show Homann buying the property with his wife joining him on the deed in 1928. The property remained in the Homan family with Helen Homan residing there during the 1920s according to telephone directories. By the 1950s, W.H. Homan was listed at this address and the family continued to own the property until 1964 when it passed to Lyle and Charlotte Engel. In 1971, the Engels sold the house to Jerry and Karen Quibell.


