

#### 7. Description

This house is estimated to have been built in 1898 according to Bremer County Assessor records. Lots 1 and 2 in Block 42 were transferred from Jennie Case and her husband to Charles H. Barrows in February 1892. During the next two years, Barrows was listed in separate newspaper accounts in conjunction with the construction of a house in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Ward that most likely was built on the north half of these lots. The 1894 Sanborn Map shows a house here with the initials "CHB" designating the owner of these lots. The building footprint could be the present dwelling. Barrows and his wife sold the property in 1899 according to transfer records. A construction completion date of ca. 1893 during Barrows' ownership is consistent with public records, house plan and design details/materials.



This 1-story frame dwelling is an example of a vernacular Gable-Front and Wing house form with an L-shaped plan. The house has what appears to be a concrete block foundation with medium-width narrow clapboard-style vinyl siding on the walls. The moderate-pitched intersecting gable roof has narrow eaves with an extend slope on the east side. The left-hand ell is filled with a small shed-roofed porch that is no enclosed with vinyl clad walls and a pair of 1/1 double-hung windows. Fenestration elsewhere includes original 2/2 double-hung windows on the main floor and short 1/1 window in the gable peaks.

A double-bay detached frame garage is located at the rear with the overhead door facing east and the access drive facing north. The garage was built in 1920 according to the Assessor estimate. It has matching vinyl siding, a moderate-pitched hipped roof with a standing-seam metal roof, and a replacement overhead door. The garage form suggests a later construction date than the Assessor estimate.

Alterations: garage door and roof, undated; vinyl siding, undated; entrance bay enclosure, undated.

### 8. Significance

The Charles H. Barrows House at 619 4<sup>th</sup> St NW is an example of a vernacular Gable-Front and Wing house form of a smaller scale. The house was built between 1892 and 1893. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource in the Harmon and LeValley NW Historic District under Criteria A and C. The garage is considered noncontributing.

According to property transfer records, Lots 1 and 2 in Block 42 were transferred from Jennie Case and her husband to Charles H. Barrows in February 1892. Jennie owned all of the block at the time. During the next two years, Barrows was listed in separate newspaper accounts in conjunction with the construction of a house in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Ward that most likely was built on the north half of these lots. It appears on the 1894 Sanborn on the north half with no building completed on the south half yet. In

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October 1899, Barrows and his wife (name unidentified) sold the south half of the lots. Barrows was not recorded as residing at this address in the 1899 city directory nor in the 1895 lowa Census.

The first occupants identified for this house were likely E.C. Haase who acquired the house in 1899. He held it until 1904 passing it to Pauline Haase (family relationship unknown). She most likely married and sold the property as Pauline Platte to Will Homan in 1920. Will owned the property with his wife Louise until 1946 when it was sold to Norman and Margaret Beebe. They in turn sold the house in 1955 to Mema and Blanche Mehmen who held it until who appear to have held it as a rental property. They sold the house in 1973 when Blanche died. The house passed to David and Judy Bluml that year.




