#### 7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1896 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built from the 1880s to the 1910s. The property was transferred from William Arns to James M. Miller in September 1890. The Miller family transferred the property in 1919 to Dietrich Kirchoff. The house was likely built sometime after the 1890 acquisition by the Bruns and before the 1894 Sanborn Map on which it appears. Several news accounts in the *Bremer County Independent* in October and November of 1894 suggest this house was being built expanded by Miller on the north edge of town adjacent to the Chicago and Great Western RR station. These references make a slightly earlier date of ca. 1894 consistent with other public records.

This frame dwelling is an example of a vernacular Gable-Front and Wing house form. Its plan similar is to a number of similar houses in the neighborhood including houses at 406 and 416 4<sup>th</sup> Ave several blocks away. The Miller House has a stone foundation with narrow clapboard-style steel siding. The front-gable section has a moderate-pitched roof with moderate width eaves and the side-gabled east wing rear wing have a similar pitch with gabled wall dormers on the slopes. A similar wall dormer is on the west slope of the main block facing 2<sup>nd</sup> St NW. The original porch filling the right-hand ell remains in place with a low-pitched shed roof, enclosed walls clad in matching siding and groups of windows above the balustrade level. The porch's foundation has rock-faced cement block suggesting the current porch is slightly later than the original house. Window openings are tall and narrow with 1/1 double-hung units in singles and pairs. The feature window is on the front façade of the front-gable wing and includes a rectilinear bay with a shed roof and four 1/1 double-hung windows.

A detached single-bay frame garage is located on the northeast corner of the house. It is clad in narrow beveled siding with the gable peak laid diagonally. It was constructed in 1920 according to Assessor records. It has a moderate-pitched front-gable roof with a single overhead door, an undated replacement.

Alterations: steel siding, undated; porch enlargement and enclosure, undated; overhead garage door, undated.

#### 8. Significance

The Miller House at 120 5<sup>th</sup> Ave NW built in ca. 1894 is an example of vernacular Gable-Front and Wing house form. It is typical of a variation of this form found in a number of locations in northwest Waverly that feature prominent gable wall dormers. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criterion A and C.

According to property transfer records, James M. Miller and his wife, Caroline, bought this property from William Arns in September 1890. The house was built before the 1894 Sanborn Map on which it appears. Several news accounts in the *Bremer County Independent* in October and November of 1894 suggest this house was being completed and/or expanded by Miller on the north edge of town at that time so it is possible that the house was begun at an earlier date in a smaller form. Miller was a stock

buyer in the 1899 city directory when the family residence was listed a half block away. By the time the 1913 directory was published, the Miller family was listed at 120 5<sup>th</sup> Ave NW with no occupation listed for James suggesting it was a retirement home. The Miller family transferred the property in 1919 to Dietrich Kirchoff who held it briefly with subsequent short-term sales beginning with a transfer to Fred Schoof in 1920. Fred and Rose Schoof, perhaps Fred's wife, were listed at 120 Fulton St. (this address) in the 1920s and 1930s telephone books. In 1934, the property was transferred to Maurice Schoof. The house was passed to the American Lutheran Church in November 1947 from the Schoof family, a practice seen for a number of houses in the Harmon and LeValley neighborhood.




