7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1896 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built before and after the turn of the 20th century. The house on this parcel is not present on the 1894 plat map. The parcel was transferred by Mary Jane Garner to Henry Arns in October 1897. During March, April and June, 1998, newspaper accounts reference construction of a house in the 2nd Ward by Henry Arns. On June 9, 1898 the *Bremer County Independent* reported that Henry and his wife were moving into their new house in the 2nd Ward. A house at this address first appears in the 1913 city directory listings as occupied by Henry and Henrietta Arns. Together these public records suggest that the house was erected in 1898, several years later than suggested by the Assessor.

This 2-story frame house is an example of a Hipped Roof, 2-story house form commonly built in the 1890s prior to the introduction of the "American Four-Square" before World War I. The house has a parged stone foundation with medium-width clapboard siding and wide corner board trim on the walls. A moderate-pitched hipped roof has a flattened peak, no dormers, and wide eaves. A small hipped roof entrance porch is centered on the south façade. It has no balustrade (removed) and turned roof posts and pilasters at the corners. Wood steps have been replaced by concrete steps. Fenestration throughout the house includes widely spaced single 1/1 double-hung windows with wide crown moldings.

A detached frame double-bay garage is estimated to have been built in 1997 according to the Assessor. The building has a gambrel roof with the overhead door in the gambrel end. The building is clad in vertical channel-cut wood siding. The garage is considered a noncontributing because of its age.

Alterations: removal of porch balustrade (undated); garage.

8. Significance

The Arns House at 420 5th Ave NW built in ca. 1898 is an example of a Hipped Roof, 2-story house form. It is a form from the late 19th century that was adapted after 1900 for use in American Four-Square houses. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criterion C and the garage is considered noncontributing.

This parcel was transferred by Mary Jane Garner to Henry Arns in October 1897. During March, April and June, 1998, newspaper accounts from the *Bremer County Independent* discuss construction of a house in the 2nd Ward by Henry Arns. On March 17, 1898 the *Bremer County Independent* reported that Arns had "commenced work on his new house in the second ward" and a month later the frame was up on the house. Less than three months later, on June 9, 1898 the *Bremer County Independent* reported that "Henry Arns and wife are moving from their farm in Warren Township into their fine new house in the second ward." In April 1914, another newspaper account talks about the completion of water service to the Arns House. About the same time, Henry and his wife Henrietta are listed as residing at this address in the 1913 city directory. Henry is listed as retired according to the directory.

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Cemetery records show Henrietta died in 1914 and Henry in 1923. The 1924 telephone directory still lists Henry Arns at 420 Fulton St. (5th Ave NW). In November 1924, property transfer records show this house passing to Mollie and Anna Arns. Sisters Mollie and Anna jointly held the house until 1939 when it was transferred to Henry C. and Minnie Buhman who passed it later that year to C.R. and Hilda Baker. In 1941 it was transferred by the Bakers to Frieda Mummelthei. In 1946, it was transferred to August and Louise Voelker.




