7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1890 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built during the turn of the 20th century. A house at this address appears in the 1913 city directory listings as occupied by C.D. and Emma Andrews. According to property transfer records, the parcel was owned by the Andrews family from December 1909 until October 1921 when it was transferred to Wm. Korte. Because the house has a concrete block foundation, it was not likely built prior to ca. 1905. A construction date of ca. 1910 appears to be more accurate for this house.

This frame house is an example of a vernacular Pyramidal or Hipped Roof, 1-story house form commonly built before and after 1900. The house has a rock faced concrete block foundation and narrow clapboard-style vinyl siding on the walls. The main block of the house has a low-pitched hipped roof with a wide low-pitched gabled attic dormer on the front slope and a projecting close-gabled side porch on the east façade. The house has moderate width eaves and a wide cornice board lined with a dentiled molding. The front porch is centered in front of the attic dormer and has a combination shed and low-pitched gable roof. The walls are enclosed with matching vinyl siding on closed balustrade and the tympanum. 1/1 windows fill the space above the closed balustrade and to either side of the front door.

Fenestration throughout the house includes widely spaced single 1/1 double-hung windows. The house's feature window is to the right of the front porch and is a variation of a cottage window form with two tall lights in the lower sash and a horizontal sash surrounded with rectangular and square stained glass lights in the upper sash. The house has no garage.

Alterations: vinyl siding (undated); enclosure of porch (undated).

8. Significance

The Andrews House at 608 5th Ave NW was built in ca. 1910 and is an example of vernacular Pyramidal or Hipped Roof, 1-story house form commonly built in Waverly before and after 1900. It is typical of other similar houses built as in-fill housing along 5th Avenue NW and intersecting streets in the Harmon and LeValley neighborhood. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C.

According to property transfer records, C.D. and Emma Andrews acquired this parcel on December 13, 1909 from John Warnke. C.D. was a laborer according to the 1913 city directory. The couple held it until October 10, 1921 when it was transferred to William Korte. He held the property until 1935 when it was sold to Minnie Kaiser. She held it until May 1946 transferring it to Herbert Kaiser.


