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7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1896 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built during the 1880s to 1910s. This vacant lot was transferred from Isaac "Ike" Woodring, a building contractor, to Henry Knapp, another building contractor, on Oct. 31, 1894. The two built houses on adjacent lots on N Oak St (5th St NW). No house appears on this lot on the 1894 Sanborn Map but Woodring's house to the north was already in place at that time. A house at this address appears in the 1899 address and 1913 city directory listings as occupied by Henry Knapp. The 1915 Sanborn Map shows both houses in place. Together these public records suggest that the Knapp House was completed in ca. 1895.

This frame dwelling is an example of a vernacular Gable-Front and Wing house form with Queen Anne trim. Its plan is similar to a number of houses in the neighborhood including the house across the street at 220 5th St NW. The Knapp House has a stone foundation with narrow wood clapboard siding on the walls, corner board trim and fish-scale wood shingles in the gable peaks. The cross-gable roof has a moderate-pitch with narrow width eaves. The front slope of the north wing is extended into the right hand ell. The east and south gable wings have canted walls on the first floor with decorative scroll-cut brackets above the angled window openings. The original porch filling the right-hand ell and wrapping the north wing remains in place. It has a combination hip and flat roof supported by a square posts. The porch has a closed balustrade clad in matching clapboard siding with a continuous scroll-cut molding along the cornice, and 1/1 storm panels above the balustrade. The porch roof may have had an ornamental railing.

Window openings in the balance of the house are generally tall and narrow with 1/1 double-hung units in singles and pairs. An exception is the wide 1/1 double-hung window on the first floor of the front-gable wing. Another feature window is the large diamond shaped window on the second floor of the north facade of the north wing.

An attached double-bay frame garage is located at the rear of the house. It was built in 1960 according to Assessor records. It has a flat roof with a pair of overhead doors facing south onto the driveway.

Alterations: porch enclosure (pre-1940); garage (1960).

8. Significance

The Knapp House at 217 5th St NW was built in ca. 1895 and is an example of a vernacular Gable-Front and Wing house form with Queen Anne trim and finishes. The house features a common vernacular form in the Harmon and LeValley neighborhood of northwest Waverly. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C.

Property records show that this lot was transferred from Isaac "Ike" Woodring, a building contractor, to Henry Knapp, another building contractor, on Oct. 31, 1894. The two built houses on adjacent lots on N Oak St (5th St NW). No house appears on Knapp's lot on the 1894 Sanborn Map but Woodring's house to the north was already in place at that time. By the time the 1899 city directory and the 1913

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city directory listings were published, the address sat 217 N Oak St (5th St NW)as occupied by Henry Knapp and his wife Annie. Henry was listed as a bridge contractor in both directories. He served in this capacity for Bremer County as well as private projects. Among his more important bridges was the Waterloo, Cedar Falls and Northern RR Bridge across the Cedar River at the west edge of Waterloo at Sans Souci Island. In 1906 Henry was elected to the office of Sheriff for Bremer County, a position he held for eight years. After serving as sheriff, he went back to road building for the county. During his working career he also served as the 2nd Ward City Councilman for 20 years. He died in January 1929. Children of Henry and Annie included Pyrle Russell, wife of Joseph Russell who resided next door to the south at 213 5th Street NW.

After Henry Knapp's death, the house was transferred to his widow, Annie. In 1930 she transferred the house to E. J. Bartlett and his wife. They held the property until 1944 selling it to John Milius who held the house until his death in 1951. It passed to his heirs who retained the house until 1956 when Evelyn and Bernard Smith, Jr. acquired it for a personal residence. In 1968, the Smiths sold the house to Mac Klossowsky and then to Harold Klossowsky in 1972 who continues as the house's owner in 2013.

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

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
