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7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1893 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built from the 1880s through the 1910s. Property transfer records show G. Kaufmann acquiring all of lots 7 and 8 in Block 50 of Harmon and LeValley Addition in March 1891. In January 1892, Kaufmann died and the property passed to his wife Bertha. The 1894 Sanborn Map does not show this house but the 1895 lowa Census taken the following year lists Bertha Kaufmann and her three children residing in the 2nd Ward, most likely at this house. Together these public records suggest that the house was erected between 1894 and 1895 making ca. 1895 a more likely completion date.

This house is an example of a vernacular Pyramidal or Hipped Roof, 1-story house form. The house has a parged stone foundation with narrow clapboard-style vinyl siding on the walls. A moderate-pitched hipped roof has a large gable wall dormer centered on the front façade and the eaves have a narrow width. Fenestration throughout the house includes various sizes of 1/1 double-hung windows, some of which have been replaced and/or resized. The property has no garage.

Alterations: vinyl siding (undated).

8. Significance

The Kaufmann House at 309 5th St NW was built in ca. 1893 and is a vernacular Pyramidal or Hipped Roof, 1-story house form. It is typical of similar houses built on sub-divided lots or as in-fill housing during the years before and after 1900 in this neighborhood. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C.

Property transfer records show G. (Gottfried) Kaufmann acquired all of lots 7 and 8 in Block 50 of Harmon and LeValley Addition in March 1891. A newspaper account from April 1891 suggests ??????????? In January 1892, Kaufmann died and the property passed to his wife Bertha. By the time the 1894 Sanborn Map was published, there was still no house on this lot making it likely that it was under construction or completed early in 1895. She and her three daughters, Julia, Mary and Berthe, who were all born in Wisconsin, resided here after Gottfried's death according to the 1895 lowa Census. When the 1899 city directory was published, the daughter Bertha was no longer in residence at home. Sister Julia was listed as employed at the "Bazaar." In August 1899, Mrs. Kaufmann transferred the house to daughter Julia and she held it until July 1912 when it was acquired by Paul Fischer most likely for rental purposes. The following year, it was sold to Fred Hartman and appears to have continued to be used as a rental property. J.L. Wren, a cooper, and his wife Marie lived here according to the 1913 city directory.

In 1920 the house passed from Hartman to Sam Norman and his wife Flora. They, too, appear to have used it as an investment property holding onto it until 1927. They sold it to Charles and Catherine See who are listed in the 1931 and 1956 telephone directories as residing here. Charles died in 1966 and Catherine in 1974 when the house was sold to Donald and Genevieve Graham.


