#### 7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1917 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built before and after World War I. A house at this address appears in the 1913 city directory listings as occupied by Mrs. John McKliget. It first passed to the McKliget family in March 1904 when John McKliget bought it from Robert Maunder. A news account in the *Bremer County Independent* on 4/14/1904 indicates that the house is under construction confirming an earlier date for this building. In January 1905, John died but his wife Katie continued to reside here until at least 1913 transferring the property in September 1929. A further confirmation of the house's ca. 1904 construction date is the use of stone rather than concrete block for the foundation – a material rarely used until after 1905. A construction date of ca. 1904 appears to be more accurate.

This 2-story frame house is an example of a Hipped Roof, 2-story house form known as the "American Four-Square" that became popular in Iowa in the decades after 1900 and continued to be built into the 1920s. The house has a parged stone foundation with narrow wood clapboard siding with cornerboard trim, wide cornice board and wide watertable. A moderate-pitched hipped roof has a hipped roof attic dormer on the front facade and moderate width eaves. The enclosed front porch spans most of the front and has been enclosed with sliding glass window panels. Retained original porch elements include the closed balustrade that extends to ground level with matching clapboard siding that flares at the outer corners and paneled piers that rest on projecting clapboard clad pedestals. The entrance is centered with three-light sidelights to either side of the glass paneled porch door. Major additions have been confined to the rear or east façade of the house through the installation of new decks and exterior access stairs between floors.

Fenestration throughout the house includes widely spaced single and paired 1/1 double-hung windows of various sizes. The front dormer has a pair of short windows with a pair of replacement single-light casement windows on the south façade in the kitchen. Feature windows include three cottage windows with large square lower sash and narrow, horizontal upper sash. One window is on the north façade and the other two are located to either side of the inner front door that features a tall glass light.

A detached frame 1-story garage is located at the rear of the property opening onto 4<sup>th</sup> Ave NW. According to Assessor records, it was built in 1934. It has a low-pitched front-gable roof with clipped gables and medium-width beveled wood siding. Windows on the west side are fixed 4-light sash including single windows flanking a passage door; there are no windows on the east. The narrow double-bay garage has a replacement overhead door in the north gable end facing the avenue.

Alterations: porch enclosure (undated); rear deck and stair additions (undated).

#### 8. Significance

The McKliget House at 322 5<sup>th</sup> St NW built was built in ca. 1904 and is a good early example of an American Four-Square house form from the post-1900. It is typical of several other Four-Square houses built during the years before and after World War I in this neighborhood. The house qualifies

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for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C with the garage also considered contributing.

This property was transferred in March 1904 to John McKliget from Robert Maunder. A news account in the *Bremer County Independent* on April 14, 1904 indicates that an addition to the former Austin Runyard house was underway by McKliget. Runyard had held this property prior to Maunder's 6-month ownership of the property. It is possible that Runyard who held the property from 1893 to 1903 began construction of the house and before it was completed, McKliget acquired it. In any case, the house was underway and completed in 1904.

In January 1905, John died but the house did not pass to his widow, Katherine or Katie, until 1915. Katie continued to reside here until at least 1913 according to city directory listings transferring the property in September 1929 to Edwin Kohlmann, proprietor of Kohlmann's Clothing, and his wife, Rachel. They resided here until the 1950s, selling the house in 1956 to Axel and Margaret Bundgaard. They resold the house in 1961 to James and Phyllis Hanson who in turn sold it in 1964 to Darold and Arvella Pipho. The Piphos held it until 1974 when Arlyn and Karen Ristau acquired it briefly. In 1976 it passed to Grant and Sherri Anderson. It passed through multiple hands for brief periods before Scott and Linda Kollenhark acquired it in 1995. They continued to own it until 2007 when current owners, Kurt and Cindy Kugel purchased it.


