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7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1893 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built during the 1880s to 1910s. No house appears at this location in the 1894 Sanborn Map, but one is listed at this address in the 1913 city directory listings as occupied by Henry Mattke, a carpenter, and his wife Emma who were tenants. Property transfer records show the house was owned by Viola C. Bruns and her husband Anton, Sr. between 1899 and 1941. Together these public records suggest that the house was erected between 1900 and 1912 and was occupied as a rental property for much of that period. A construction date of ca. 1900 appears to be more accurate.

This 2-story frame house is an example of an uncommon vernacular form that combines a Hipped Roof, 2-story main block with a Side-Gabled, 2-story wing. The house has a parged stone foundation with wide aluminum siding. A moderate-pitched hipped roof has a flattened peak with broad gabled wall dormers on the front and north facades; a side gabled south wing has a steeply pitched gabled wall dormer as well. Two sections of shed-roofed porch centered on the main block's front façade and tucked in the left-hand ell are linked by an open deck. Turned posts and widely place spindles and lattice skirting appear on the deck. Fenestration throughout the house includes widely spaced single 1/1 double-hung windows with a few replacement windows that are shorter in size.

A detached frame single-bay garage is located immediately south of the house and opens onto 5th St NW. It has a very small foot print with narrow clapboard-style vinyl siding, a front-gable roof and a replacement overhead door. Assessor records estimate that it was constructed in 1930

Alterations: aluminum siding (undated); porch and deck reconstruction (undated); garage siding (undated); foundation parging (undated); applied shutters (undated).

8. Significance

The Bruns Rental House at 523 5th St NW was built in ca. 1900 and is an example of a vernacular form that combines a Hipped Roof, 2-story main block with a Side-Gabled, 2-story wing. It is an example of a larger scale rental property held by one of the families in the neighborhood that held a number of rental dwellings. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C while the garage is considered noncontributing.

Property transfer records show this property was owned by Viola C. Bruns and her husband Anton, Sr. between 1899 and 1941. Earlier in the 1890s, the Anton was identified in a number of newspaper accounts as building houses in the 2nd Ward, including several Gable-Front and Wing houses. No house appears at this location in the 1894 Sanborn Map, but one is listed at this address in the 1913 city directory listings as occupied by Henry Mattke, a carpenter, and his wife Emma who were likely tenants of the Bruns family. It is also possible that Mattke participated in construction of the house.

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In April 1941, Viola and Anton transferred the house to A.T. Bruns, Jr. and his wife Alice. They held the house until 1949 when they sold it to Mae and Emil Ackmann who resided here for a number of years.

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




