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7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1905 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built in the post-1900l period. Property transfer records show J.H. Neverman(n) acquired the property in November 1905 from C.D. Hurlbut. A series of news accounts in 1906 describes the house as being under construction with the Nevermanns moving in late September 1906. Contractor was W.H. Woodring. A construction date of 1906 is more consistent with public records.

This 2-story frame house is an example of the blending of the Classical Revival and Queen Anne styles at the turn of the 20th century. The house has an early rock-faced concrete block foundation with narrow wood clapboard siding, and pilasters serving as corner board trim. The dimpled block design is extremely early and rare for Waverly and the block dimensions are oversized in terms of both height and width. A complex roof plan includes a moderate-pitched hipped roof at the center with projecting 2-story gabled wings of various depths and a 1½-story hipped roof service wing with a large gable wall dormer on the rear facade. The roof sections have flared edges, wide eaves and in some cases, extended slopes. The south wing forms an ell that is filled with a low-pitched hipped roof porch and second floor balcony; the porch spans the front of the front-gable wing as well. A low-pitched pediment is at the south end of the porch over the entrance steps. Its tympanum is filled with matching narrow clapboard siding. Three smooth finished, battered columns are spread across the front supporting a wide architrave of the porch roof. The small upper level balcony at the southeast corner has a closed balustrade with clapboard cladding and a single half-height matching column. On the lower level, the non-original balustrade has square spindles moderately spaced. The porch skirting has closely spaced vertical boards in lieu of panels of diagonal or vertical lattice.

Fenestration throughout the house includes widely spaced single and paired 1/1 double-hung windows of various sizes with wide crown moldings on the upper frame. Second floor windows have belt courses between the attic level forming the upper window frame. Feature windows on the lower level include the window group on the south façade that consists of a large double-hung unit flanked by short and narrow 1/1 units. On the front façade, the first floor an angular bay contains a regular 1/1 window unit and a cottage window with a single square sash topped by a horizontal sash with a curvilinear design executed in leaded beveled glass. The gable peaks of each of the wings feature horizontal windows with geometric patterns forming a single diamond outlined by stained and clear glass lights.

A detached frame 2-story carriage house/barn is located at the rear of the property. It has a side gable roof of moderate pitch, beveled wood siding, corner board trim, and a shed-roofed addition along the north side to provide for extended storage space of longer automobiles. The building has a standing seam metal roof. Fenestration includes square four-light windows and the overhead door is a replacement. The Assessor dates the building as having been constructed in 1905, contemporary with the house.

Alterations: house has no major changes; rear deck (undated); metal roof and replacement door for garage (undated).

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8. Significance

The John H. and Sophia Neverman House at 121 NW was built in ca. 1905 and is an example of the blending of the Classical Revival and Queen Anne styles at the turn of the 20th century. The central Hipped-Roof, 2-story form has three gabled wings and a hipped roof service wing making for a complex roof plan. This house was built at a prominent intersection with W.H. Woodring serving as the house contractor. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C and the carriage house/barn is considered contributing as well.

Property transfer records show J.H. Neverman(n) acquiring the property in November 1905 from C.D. Hurlbut though a news account in the *Bremer County Independent* as early as March 15, 1903 indicate that "J.H. Neverman, [sic] of Triopoli is coming to Waverly to make his home. He will erect a fine residence on the corner south of the home of his son-in-law, F.P. Hagemann, in the Second ward." A series of news accounts in 1906 describe the house as being under construction beginning in April on a lot north of W.H. Woodring's home at 604 West Bremer Avenue. Woodring had a furniture and cabinet business and also served as contractor for the Nevermann House. By May 1906, the *Bremer County Independent* reported that "Contractor Woodring has Mr. Nevermann's new house in the Second ward well under way. This house will be another fine addition to one of the prettiest streets in Waverly." The Nevermanns moved into their new house in late September 1906 according to the paper.

John H. Nevermann was a native of Germany and his wife Sophia (Wente) Nevermann was born in Bremer County. Biographical accounts indicate that Nevermann became an extensive landowner and a very successful "agriculturalist" in Bremer County. John died in 1922 and Sophia transferred the family home to her daughter and lawyer son-in-law, Fred P. Hagemann and his wife Sophia, in 1931. The house passed to Fred and Sophia's son, Vernon F. Hagemann and his wife Myrtle in 1935. From 1946 to 1950, the house's lower level was operated as a tea room with seating for 30 guests. It was run by Myrtle Hageman. In 1951, the Hagemanns sold the property to Joseph and Delores Jacoby who held it until 1963 when they sold off the north half of the parcel to James and Dixie Lynch. At one time the house and quarter block on which it stood were surrounded by an iron fence.



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
