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7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1894 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form is typical of large houses built in Waverly from the 1880s through the 1910s in one or more phases. Bremer County Property Transfer Records show Thomas Woodring buying a section of the northeast corner of Block 60 from M.N. LeValley in 1873 and again ten years later in 1883. By the time the 1885 lowa Census was published, Woodring and his wife Emily were listed as residing in a house at lots 1 and 2 in Block 60. The 1894 Sanborn Map depicts a house in place on these two lots that matches the footprint of the current house. Therefore, a construction date of ca. 1885 is consistent with public records for this property.

This 2-story frame house is an example of a vernacular Gable-Front-and Wing house form that became popular in the Midwest beginning in the decades after the Civil War. In this case, the house has an L-shaped floor plan with a left-hand ell filled with a hipped roof porch and an enclosed section that wraps the south side. The house has a stone foundation beneath the house's medium-width clapboard-style vinyl/steel siding. The house has a moderate pitched intersecting gable roof with pent gable ends. The porch has a concrete grade-level deck with wrought iron posts for roof supports and no balustrade. Fenestration includes single 1/1 double-hung windows with crown moldings. A large square single-light is to the left of the front entrance and small square windows are in the pent gable peaks. An attached double-bay garage is at the rear opening onto 2nd Ave NW built in 1990 according to Assessor records.

Alterations: garage addition (1990); siding (undated); porch trim and partial enclosure (undated); window changes (undated).

8. Significance

The Thomas and Emily Woodring House at 221 6th St NW was built in ca. 1885 as one of the first houses in this part of the Harmon and LeValley neighborhood. It is an example of a vernacular Gable-Front-and Wing house form. Woodring was a cabinet maker and homebuilder. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C.

Property transfer records show Thomas Woodring first acquired this property in 1873 and ten years later in 1883, the property transfer was recorded a second time. This suggests that the house was not erected until after the second transfer. This would be consistent with the 1885 lowa Census which shows that Thomas Woodring and his wife Emily were listed as residing in a house at lots 1 and 2 in Block 60. The 1894 Sanborn Map also depicts a house in place on these two lots that matches the footprint of the current house. Thomas Woodring was listed in the 1885 Census as a cabinetmaker and in the 1895 Census as a merchant. He was one of several brothers with the firm Woodring Brothers, furniture makers and undertakers. In 1895, Emily died and it appears the house passed through Sheriff's Sale in 1898.

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Rozilia Woodring took ownership in 1899 and transferred the house in 1899 to William Cronin. In 1906 after William' death, the house passed to Mary Cronin, his wife. She was listed as residing at this address in the 1913 city directory as a widow along with her daughter Lida Cronin. Mary died in 1926.


