#### 7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1901 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built at the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. The property was transferred from Vacina Chesley in May 1893 to Franklin Peck. Peck was listed as building a house in the 5<sup>th</sup> ward in the *Bremer County Independent* on 11/15/1893. The 1913 city directory shows the house at 525 Cherry St (7<sup>th</sup> St NW) occupied by A.C. Epley. These public records suggest the house was constructed in ca. 1893 rather than 1901.

This frame house is an example of a Queen Anne Style Hipped Roof, 1½-story house form that was popular in the 1890s in Waverly. This example has a parged stone and concrete block foundation with asbestos shingle siding on the walls. The house has a steeply-pitched pyramidal roof with steeply pitched gabled wall-dormers on the east, south and north sides. A low-pitched side-gable 1-story wing extends on the south façade with a closed gabled end and an exposed reddish brown brick chimney. The house has a shallow shed-roofed front porch on the main block with a pediment extending out to the centered entrance steps. The tympanum features a sunburst panel. The porch foundation has been replaced with smooth finished concrete block and the balustrade is covered with matching asbestos shingles. Turned porch supports are at the outer and inner corners with a spindled frieze extending along the porch roof cornice. A second, small porch is tucked in the left-hand ell formed by the south wing. It has matching balustrade, porch post and frieze trim. Fenestration includes 1/1 double-hung windows of various sizes. There are no feature windows. The property has a frame barn located along the west property line. It has weatherboard siding with a side-gable roof and a small shed-roofed lean-to along the south side. The building accesses onto 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue NW.

Alterations: Transite (asbestos) siding, undated; porch concrete block foundation, undated; stone foundation parging, undated.

#### 8. Significance

The Franklin and Eliza Peck House at 525 7th St NW was built in ca. 1893 and is an example of a Queen Anne Style Hipped Roof 1½-story house form that became popular in the decade prior to the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century with several similar examples found in Waverly from this period. Franklin Peck opened a downtown jewelry store in 1879. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C. The city barn is considered contributing because of the rarity of intact examples of this building form in the neighborhood.

According to property transfer records, the parcel was transferred from Vacina Chesley in May 1893 to Franklin Peck. Peck was listed as building a house in the 5<sup>th</sup> ward in the *Bremer County Independent* on November 15, 1893 with a follow-up article on January 4, 1894. The house remained in the Peck family eventually being used as a rental property. In 1913 city directory shows the house at 525 Cherry St (7<sup>th</sup> St NW) occupied by Lydia and A.C. Epley who worked at Coddington & Laird, dealers in coal, ice, grain, wood and implements on W. Bremer Ave. The house remained in the Peck family with Frank and Eliza residing next door at 721 5<sup>th</sup> Ave NW during the 1920s. In 1939 the property passed from the Peck family heirs to Fred Hess who resold the property in 1942 to Amanda Westenberger. She and her husband sold the property to Henry and Loreen Grube in 1947.




