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| Curtis, Sidney H. and Sarah, House (east half) | Bremer |
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7. Description

This 2-story single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1935 according to Bremer County Assessor records. Property transfer records show the property acquired by S.H. Curtis prior to ca. 1865 when he purchased Lots 1 and 2 in Fractional Block 5 of the Original Town. Newspaper accounts from April 1891 through January 1892 describe the house under construction on Water Street (1st Street) including one notice on January 21, 1892 describing the house as "finished." The April 23, 1891 Waverly Republican article notes that "Mr. Curtis new residence will be built from plans furnished by modern architects and will be spacious, comfortable and pretty."

This frame house is an example of a 2-story Queen Anne Style house of the Hipped Roof, Lower Cross-Gabled form. Historic photographs delineating porch detailing shows the house to be a Spindlework sub-type. It has a moderate pitched hipped roof on the main block with pent-gabled rectangular wings and angular bays set at lower heights. The rear façade has a 2-story gabled wing and 1-story attached gabled garage. A 1-story hipped roof porch wraps the front façade and a section of the north façade. The Curtis House has a stone block foundation with narrow-width wood clapboard for the first and second levels and cove-cut wood shingles in the gable peaks and for the flared belt course between the first and second levels. A series of rectangular panels extends along cornice beneath the wide eaves of the upper level.

The moderate-pitched hipped roof entrance porch is located between the projecting angular bay of the front façade and the rectangular wing on the north façade. A low-pitched pediment is set above the entrance steps at the north end of the front façade. Its tympanum has a panel filled with pointed moldings. A pair of elaborate double doors beneath the pediment features a series of narrow, horizontal panels and pointed moldings in the lower halves with beveled glass sash with square and rectangular lights in the upper halves. The current porch detailing includes narrowly spaced square spindles in the balustrade with smooth finished floor-to-ceiling columns, all installed sometime after 1961 according to a photo taken that year. Based on earlier historic photographs of the house, the original balustrade design and porch posts were turned rather than the Classical design now present. The porch skirting now includes closely spaced vertical boards rather than the original latticework set in curved arches.

Fenestration includes cottage windows and 1/1 double-hung windows with shorter upper sash with both located on the front façade. Similar double-hungs are located elsewhere. Decorative windows with Classical designs and ornamentation include a semi-circular sash with four fanlights in the front gable peak, a similar but larger sash with a double row of lights in the north gable, and two ocular windows with keystones and divided lights in the entrance area and above the front doors.

The house according to oral history accounts was originally part of a house nearly twice the size with the present building occupying the east half of a house for the Curtis' extended family. At an unknown date the two halves were separated and a new rear section was added to the house at 302 1st Street SE. That 2-story gable roofed wing is now clad in channel cut siding with a 1-story double car garage at the west end. Built in 1935 according to Bremer County Assessor records, it is possible that this is the date that the two house sections were divided. The west half of the original house was moved

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closer to the Cedar River and took 88 2nd Avenue SE as its address. The west half of the Curtis House remains in this location in 2012.

Alterations: porch element changes (undated); rear addition and garage (ca. 1935).

8. Significance

The Curtis House (east half) is an example of a 1890s era Queen Anne Style house form with Free Classic detailing and a 2-story, Hipped Roof with Lower Cross Gable form. The house was part of the main wave of homebuilding in the neighborhood that extended from the 1880s through World War I. Its owners, Sidney H. Curtis and his wife Sarah built the house in 1891-92. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places individually under Criterion C.

Sidney H. Curtis immigrated to Iowa from Erie County, Pennsylvania in 1855. He opened the first hardware store in Bremer County the same year. He became a civic leader and eventually was associated with the Republican Party. He held the position as a Bremer County Supervisor and was chairman of the Board of Supervisors in 1873. His sons joined him in the hardware business and continued it after his death in 1914. A brief biography taken from *The American Artisan and Hardware Record* in 1915 appears below:

Sidney H. Curtis of Waverly was a pioneer merchant of Northern Iowa, having operated a hardware store on the same site for fifty-nine years, passed away on October 25th.

He had been a member of our association since 1903. Sidney H. Curtis was born in Oneida County, New York, Oct. 19th, 1829; was apprenticed as a timer at the age of fifteen in Eric County, Pennsylvania. He moved to Waverly in 1855 and opened the first hardware store in Bremer County and the business is still being operated on the same site by his sons.

A pioneer in business and in the civic upbuilding of his town and county, his name is prominently identified with all that goes to the upbuilding of the state. His activities were given to his business in preference to political preferment, although he was closely connected with the social centers of his community in church and Masonic work, being a charter member of his lodge and for fifty years a trustee of the Methodist Church.

In every way Mr. Curtis stood for what is best in the life of the town and county of which he was so eminent a representative.




