### 7. Description

This 2-story single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1893 according to Bremer County Assessor records. Property Transfer records show the parcel transferring from Lina Herman and husband to Leopold Levy on April 26, 1886 suggesting that the house could have been built by Levy prior to 1893. The date range is consistent with the architectural style of the house.

This frame house is an example of a 2-story Queen Anne Style Gable-Front-and-Wing house form. This pattern book variation retains features an extended slope on the side-gable section to form the roof over the porch tucked in the right-hand ell. The house has a stone foundation with narrow-width clapboard-style vinyl siding covering the original wood siding on the first and second levels. The front gable retains the original finishes that include a semi-circular panel with square inset panels and radiating wood panels infilling the balance of the semi-circle. Vinyl shingle siding is used in the side gable peaks. The house has a moderate-pitched intersecting gable roof with shallow eaves and a low-pitched hipped roof attic dormer centered on the front slope over the porch.

The roof porch projects forward from the main block and originally had semicircular arches along the front and south sides according to an historic photograph. At an unknown date the original arched detailing, porch posts, balustrade and raised decking were removed and replaced with the current porch finishes. These include a concrete slab set at-grade, square posts extending to the roof edge, and concrete pre-formed steps set at the entrance.

Fenestration includes 1/1 double-hung windows of various sizes throughout most of the house. A pair of four-light fixed sash are in the front dormer and a large single-light fixed sash is in the parlor opening to the north of the porch replacing an earlier 1/1 double-hung window. The house has a 2-story gable-roofed barn located to the rear along the alley. A double-bay overhead door is in the west gable end with single 6-light windows in the gable peak. An upper level hay mow door faces the alley. The barn is undated but likely was constructed soon after the house was erected.

Alterations: exterior changes include the addition of vinyl siding (undated); interior changes for apartment conversion and single-family remodeling (1941 and 1950); and removal of porch trim, balustrade and decking (post-1989).

### 8. Significance

The Levy House at 317 1<sup>st</sup> Street SE is an example of a moderately preserved Queen Anne Style pattern book house form. It was home to Leopold Levy, a clothing store owner, and his wife Mathilda from the time it was built in ca. 1893 until they sold it in 1904. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under the Criterion C.

Leopold Levy was a native of New York state where he worked as a clothier before moving to Des Moines and then Waverly in 1881. Levy acquired this property in 1886 from Lina Herman and her husband when the Herman's subdivided the Lots 5 and 6 to separate owners. He opened his own clothing emporium located at 200 E. Bremer Avenue (see building photo below). His business

advertised the sale of men's clothing, gents furnishing goods, hats and caps. While residing in Waverly, he served a four year term as trustee for the lowa College for the Blind in Vinton beginning in 1894 as well as other local boards. Mathilda Levy served on the Waverly Library Board when the Carnegie Library was under construction in ca. 1904.

In June 1904, the Levy family sold their house to Katherine Sullivan. She resided in the house for nearly 30 years during which time she served as principal of the Waverly High School. In July 1941 the house was sold to Ed Guiney who converted the house to a rental duplex. In 1950 it was sold to George Redick who with his wife remodeled the interior and converted it to a single-family residence again.


