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7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1920 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built during the post World War I period.

This 2-story frame house is an example of a Bungalow Cottage house form. This variation has a broad side-gabled roof with a front slope that extends over the front porch and wide eaves. The roof was clad in modern standing seam metal sometime between 2009 and 2011. A wide shed-roofed attic dormer is centered on the front slope and a 1-story hipped roof addition (ca. 2009) is setback along the north side. The house has a rock-faced concrete foundation with a poured concrete foundation under the north addition. Sections of the block foundation have been parged with a smooth finish. An exposed reddish-brown brick chimney is centered on the north gable. The house has medium-width clapboard-style vinyl siding and no ornamentation. The front porch has been altered with the removal of the deck and original porch posts, pedestals and balustrade. It has been replaced by a concrete slab and steps at the entrance.

Fenestration includes 1/1 double-hung windows in singles and pairs. Cottage window openings in the front façade and dining room on the south replaced by new windows with large single-light upper sash and short horizontal operable sash along the lower edges. The only original sash are a six-light horizontal window in the south gable peak and a horizontal window with five vertical lights on the first floor to the right of the exposed brick chimney. The large window opening on the upper level of the south side now has a pair of vertical sliding sash set beneath a fixed horizontal sash – perhaps replacing the original cottage window or a pair of double-hung windows.

A detached hipped-roof garage is set back along the south side of the house with the overhead door opening onto 1st Street SE.

Alterations: porch changes (undated); north addition (post-2009); vinyl siding (undated); metal roof (between 2009 and 2011); and window changes (pre-2009).

8. Significance

The house at 409 1st Street SE built in ca. 1920 is an example of a Bungalow Cottage house form the post-World War I period. It is typical of several other Bungalow Style houses built as in-fill housing during the years before and after the war. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criterion C and the garage is considered noncontributing.




