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

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7. Description

This 2-story single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1880 according to Bremer County Assessor records. Though this date is consistent with the design and form of the house, other information about the neighboring house to the south suggests that the Gross House may have been built at a later date.

This Gross House is an example of a vernacular 2-story Front-Gable house form. It has a moderate-pitched front-gable roof with narrow eaves and a flat-roof porch roof extending along the front and a

continuing roof and deck along the south façade. On the south side, the porch has a deck ends in a shed roofed room addition. A smaller hipped roof porch is set back along the north façade along the entrance drive. The original porch arrangement appears on the 1927 Sanborn Map (right) showing the shallower dimension of the porch on the front but noting that the porch actually had a wraparound design. The porch now has a roof line only on the front with a section projecting forward slightly over the entrance steps that are centered on the front.



The deck has been removed and replaced with a concrete slab on the front and south façade. The deck remains on the north porch with the skirting panels replaced by plastic lattice panels and new wood columns, square spindles and turned spindles replacing the original elements.

The house has a stone foundation with a parged finish and medium width clapboard-style vinyl siding on the walls. The original front entrance has been replaced by a window on the right side and the concrete steps abandoned. This was done in ca. 2009 with the new front entrance now via the side porch. Screen panels on that porch have been removed since 2009. Fenestration includes multi-light double-hung replacement sash with 9/9 windows on the first floor, front; 6/6 windows on the second floor; and smaller 6/6 sash elsewhere. A semi-circular window (now covered) was in the gable peak. A former entrance onto the south porch wing has also been abandoned. The house has a detached1-story twin-bay garage with a broad, low-pitched front-gable roof and matching vinyl siding. According to Bremer County Assessor records, the garage was erected in 1998.

Alterations: porch decking and roofing changes (undated); vinyl siding (undated); and window changes.

8. Significance

The Gross House at 425 1st Street SE is an example of a vernacular 2-story Front-Gable house form that most likely had either Italianate or Queen Anne ornamentation when original constructed. The house was part of the main wave of homebuilding in the neighborhood that extended from the 1880s through the post-World War I years. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as contributing resource to the historic district under Criterion C and the garage is considered noncontributing.

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By 1912, this property was owned by Dr. James N. Gross. Dr. Gross was a dentist who had practiced in Waverly since sometime 1871 making him one of the earliest practicing dentists in Iowa when he died in 1919. An early biography appears below:

Dr. J. N. GROSS, dentist, is a native of Brighton, Canada West, and was born Aug 21st, 1837. He is a son of Pitkin and Rebecca (CORY) GROSS. The Doctor received his preparatory education at his home, and in 1862 began reading medicine with his father, who was a graduate of Dartmouth College, N.H. During the winter of 1862-3 he attended lectures at the Buffalo Medical College and graduated from that institution in 1865. The same year he began practicing at Brighton and there remained for nearly two years. In October of 1866 he located in Charles City, Iowa. Abandoning the practice of medicine, he entered the office of Dr. A H. Marsh, a brother-in-law, and began practicing dentistry. During the spring of 1869, Mr. GROSS removed from Charles City to Osage, Mitchell County, where he remained about two years, and thence to Waverly, Bremer County, where he now resides, and is the oldest established dentist in the city. In 1872, he was united in marriage with Miss Mary E. SMITH, daughter of John SMITH, who is a pioneer of Bremer County. The Doctor is a member of Masonic fraternity - the Blue Lodge and Chapter. (*History of Bremer County, Iowa*, 1883, page 878)

Cemetery records indicate that he was married to Marie Smith Gross rather than Mary and that his middle inititial was "M" rather than "N." The brief biography below describes his professional career and appeared after his death in the *Iowa Dental Bulletin*, Volume V, April 1919, p. 8.

Dr. J. M. Gross of Waverly, one of the oldest practicing dentists in the state, died the latter part of February. He began practice of dentistry at Waverly in 1871. From 1883 until 1889, he occupied the chair of dental pathology and therapeutics at the Western Dental College at Kansas City. In 1899 Dr. Gross returned to Waverly and continued in active practice until his health began to fail him last September.

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
