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#### 7. Description

This 2-story single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1940 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The design for the house is consistent with an earlier date by about three decades. Property transfer records show the property acquired by C.H. Leitha in August 1911 from H.E. Moehling who was having his own residence erected next door at 322 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave. SE at the time. The 1913 city directory lists the Leitha family as residing at 316 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave. SE suggesting the house was completed in ca. 1912.

The Leitha House is an example of a variation of the Queen Anne Style sometimes referred to as a "Princess Anne" house form. This example also incorporates Craftsman Style fenestration either as an original or replacement design. It has a moderate pitched hipped roof on the main block with a gabled wall dormer off-set to the left on the front façade and shallow, 2-story gabled wings projecting on the east and west facades. Each of the gables had returning cornices. A defining feature for Princess Anne houses is a short tower or turret, in this case located at the northwest corner of the house. A low-pitched hipped roof porch wraps the northeast corner of the house with Craftsman Style 3/1 windows above the closed balustrade. The Leitha House has a parged concrete block foundation with narrow-width steel and vinyl clapboard-style siding on the walls of the house and the enclosed porch. The porch skirting panels have been replaced with parged concrete block.

Fenestration includes 3/1 double-hung windows with vertical lights in the upper sashes for the windows on the first floor and porch. The windows are of varied size. On the upper level, the double-hung windows have a 1/1 configuration. It is possible that one window has been removed in the tower, upper level. The windows in the west wing, lower level are set at 45 degree angles.

The house has a double-bay frame garage opening onto the alley. It was completed in 1986 according to Assessor records, has a broad gable roof and matching vinyl siding.

Alterations: porch enclosure (undated); garage (1986); siding (undated); window alterations (undated).

#### 8. Significance

The Leitha House is an example of a variation of the Queen Anne Style sometimes referred to as a "Princess Anne" form. The house was part of the main wave of homebuilding in the neighborhood that extended from the 1880s through World War I. Its owners, Chris and Ruth Leitha, built the house in ca, 1912. Because Chris worked as a carpenter, it is possible that he built all or part of the house. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource under Criterion C and the garage is noncontributing.

Chris Leitha purchased this lot from H.E. Moehling, who also held the lot next door to the east where he was having a personal residence constructed in 1911. The sale took place in August 1911 suggesting that construction on the Leitha House continued into 1912. Chris and his wife Ruth were residing here a year later when the 1913 city directory was published. The Leithas held the property until 1920 when it was transferred to W.D. Bailey, a commercial traveler, and his wife Brittie.



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
