7. Description

This 1½-story single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1950 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built during and after World War II. Separate newspaper accounts confirm the construction of the house for the Lageschulte family.

This frame house is an example of a vernacular 1½-story Minimal Traditional house form. This variation has a detached garage and a narrow width that makes this house suitably sized for this lot. The house has a concrete block foundation with wide clapboard-style aluminum siding. The house has a broad moderate-pitched side-gable roof with no eaves and gabled entrance bay centered on the front façade.

Fenestration includes 1/1 double-hung windows of various sizes and shapes in singles and pairs. Wide single windows are placed to either side of the entrance bay, single lights are asymmetrically placed on the gabled ends, and pairs of small 1/1 units are centered beneath the gable peaks. In 2010 according to Assessor records a double-car garage was constructed parallel to the alley at the rear of the house. It is clad in narrow clapboard style vinyl siding and has a double-width overhead door and passage door set beneath the broad gable roof.

Alterations: siding (undated); garage (2010); entrance steps (undated).

8. Significance

The Lageschulte House at 315 2nd Street SE is an example of a vernacular 1½-story Minimal Traditional house from the post-World War II period. It is typical of houses built as in-fill housing during this period. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criterion C.

According to newspaper accounts, the summer of 1950 was experiencing a construction boom. At least 22 homes, including the Lageschulte House, were already under construction in Waverly by midyear with more planned. This was considered an indication that population was heading up. The federal census figures show Waverly's population rising from 4,156 in 1940 to 5,124 or nearly 25% in the decade. The summer homebuilding story had predicted the rise of population would be substantial and it was correct later that year when the federal census numbers were released.


