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7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1925 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with similar houses in Waverly built using this form from ca. 1900 to 1920. Property Transfer Records show this parcel acquired by Laura Laird in March 1909 from Charles Kohagen who had planned to build a house on the lot five years earlier. The Lairds proceeded with construction of their home during the summer of 1909 according to newspaper accounts. By 1913, city directory listings show the house at 207 Harmon Street (3rd Street SE) occupied by Ralph and Laura Laird. The correct year for construction for this house is ca. 1909.

This house is an example of a blending of the Colonial Revival and Bungalow styles using a Side-Gable 2-story house form. The 1927 Sanborn Map (right) incorrectly identifies the house as 1-story. It has a broad moderate-pitched side-gable roof with a recessed open porch extending across the full front façade. Sometime between 2009 and 2011, photographs show that the porch was restored to its current appearance through the removal of infill windows. The massive clapboard clad piers at the outer corners and the low clapboard clad balustrade remain. Three square wood columns were added on each side of the entrance steps to support the wide, open span of the porch's upper edge and the eave. The porch restoration revealed the extant original entrance door with its oval beveled glass and carved frame. The building's rear has a 2-story hipped roof section and a 1-story attached garage.

The Laird House has a tall rock-faced concrete block foundation with narrow-width wood clapboard siding on the walls. The front façade features a large gabled attic dormer on the front slope with a recessed balcony. The exterior flared walls are clad in square-cut shingles and the interior walls of the balcony are covered in clapboard siding. A low balustrade composed of square spindles extends across the front of the balcony. The dormer has a closed gable peak, also clad in square-cut shingles, with a small oval window centered in the gable. The recessed rear wall of the dormer/balcony has an entrance door centered between large 1/1 double-hung windows. The door has a single-light in the upper half.

Fenestration includes mostly single and grouped 1/1 double-hung windows of varying sizes and widths on the first and second floors. On the front façade, lower level a feature window group left of the entrance consists of a wide 1/1 double-hung window in the center flanked by narrow 1/1 double-hung units. The north and south gable peaks include oval windows with four keystones carrying on the Colonial Revival design. On the north façade, a cottage window opens off the parlor on the lower level. Another feature window group is the angled bay window on the south façade with short 1/1 double-hung units likely surrounding a window seat. The multi-light upper sashes in the outer angled sides have starburst patterns – another Colonial Revival motif.

The attached double-bay frame garage dates from 1988 according to Assessor records. It has a twin doors along the south slope of the gabled addition and is clad in vinyl clapboard-style siding. A deck has also been added along the south side surrounding the bay window with a multi-light French door and matching panels providing deck access. The deck has a square-spindled balustrade.

Alterations: garage addition (1988); porch restoration (ca. 1910); deck added (undated).

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8. Significance

The Laird House at 209 3rd St SE was built in 1909 and is an example of a well-executed blending of the Colonial Revival and Bungalow styles using a Side-Gable 2-story house form. The builders of the house were Ralph Laird, a farm implement dealer, and his wife Laura. The house qualifies qualified individually for the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C and as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C.

Ralph Laird (1876-1940) and his wife Laura (1883-1940) acquired this parcel in March 1909 from Charles Kohagan. Ralph grew up in rural Bremer County and formed a partnership with his brother in an implement business. By 1913 after the Lairds built this house, Ralph was in partnership with A.B. Coddington as "Coddington & Laird" selling coal, ice, grain, wood and implements. In 1929, Coddington died. The business reorganized as Laird's Incorporated continuing implement sales and adding automobiles. The 122 West Bremer Avenue building burned in a major conflagration in 1933.



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
