

7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1920 according to Bremer County Assessor records. Property transfer records show the property acquired by Henry Kasemeier in 1882(3) from Fred Krause and his wife. The 1885 Iowa Census shows Henry Kasemeier and his wife Emma residing on Lot 4 in Fractional Block 8 at this address. The 1899 and 1913 city directories both show the Kasemeier family in residence at this address. Together, this information confirms a likely construction date of ca. 1883 rather than 1920.

This 2-story frame house is an example of a vernacular Front-Gable house form with Italianate detailing. It has a L-shaped floor plan with a moderate-pitched front-gable roof on the main block and a side-gable roof of similar pitch on the rear, north addition. The eaves are wide and, given the house's age, it might have originally had Italianate Style brackets, though they are not present now.



The Kasemeier House has a parged stone foundation and its walls are covered with narrow-width clapboard-style vinyl siding and corner board trim. The three-bay front façade has three segmental arched 1/1 double-hung windows on the upper level and a flat-roofed entrance porch on the left façade and a flat roofed angular bay window on the right half. Each of the windows had a segmental arch with a matching panel above and a rectangular panel below. The small porch has full-height piers at the outer corners with chamfered edges. The low balustrades have closely spaced, thick spindles. The skirting has replacement diagonal lattice work. The porch entrance door has a segmental arch with a wide crown molding. The door has two horizontal panels in the lower half and a tall, single light window in the upper half likely a replacement for an earlier etched glass or divided light sash. Fenestration on the balance of the house includes evenly spaced 1/1 double-hung windows on the north and south facades with each of the windows having pediment shaped lintels. and the upper level units have

The free standing garage has a double-wide side-gable with matching vinyl clapboard-style siding on the walls. According to Assessor records it was constructed in 1900. However, the current garage was built in recent years. The property had a 2-story city barn at the southeast corner of the lot in 1927.

Alterations: siding, and window changes (undated, likely post-1960); garage (undated).

8. Significance

The Kasemeier House is an example of a vernacular Front-Gable house form with Italianate detailing built in ca. 1883. The house was part of the main wave of homebuilding in the neighborhood that extended from the 1880s through World War I. Its owners, Henry Kasemeier, a banker, and his wife Emma, had the house built. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places under Criteria A and C as a contributing resource in the historic district. The garage is considered noncontributing.

In 1882(3) Henry Kasemeier bought Lot 4 in Fractional Block 8 from Fred Krause and his wife. The 1885 lowa Census shows Henry Kasemeier and his wife Emma residing on Lot 4 in Fractional Block 8 at this address indicating that the house was in place by that time. In the 1899 city directory, Henry was listed as an assistant cashier at the First National Bank of Waverly. By 1913 the city directory indicated that he had been promoted to cashier at the bank. Emma passed away in 1929 and Henry in 1934. Both are buried at Harlington Cemetery.




