#### 7. Description

This 1½-story single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1951 according to Bremer County Assessor records. Telephone directories provide the first listing for the house in 1953 suggesting a slightly later date. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built during and after World War II.

This frame house is an example of a vernacular 1½-story Minimal Traditional house form. This variation has an attached single-bay garage at one end and a narrow width that makes this house suitably sized for this lot. The house has a concrete block foundation with Transite™ asbestos shingle siding – likely an original installation. The house has a moderate-pitched side-gable roof with shallow eaves and no dormers. An enclosed entrance bay has a front gable roof with the door off-set to the right. The east gable end has a small balcony that likely serves as a fire escape for the second floor.

Fenestration includes 1/1 double-hung windows of various sizes in singles on both levels. The entrance retains its original slab door with three staggered height vertical lights set in the upper half.

Alterations: conversion to duplex (undated); addition of a balcony at the west end above the garage (undated).

#### 8. Significance

The Lageschulte House at 115 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue SE is an example of a well-preserved vernacular 1½-story Minimal Traditional house form the post-World War II period. It is typical of houses built as in-fill housing during this period. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criterion C.

According to newspaper accounts, the summer of 1950 was experiencing a construction boom. At least 22 homes were already under construction in Waverly by mid-year with more planned for completion the following year when this house was finished. A homebuilding boom such as this was considered an indication that population was heading up. The federal census figures show Waverly's population rising from 4,156 in 1940 to 5,124 or nearly 25% in the decade. The summer homebuilding news story had predicted the rise of population would be substantial and it was correct later that year when the federal census numbers were released.

Edward and Elsie Lageschulte previously resided in rural Waverly where they operated a farm until 1952. The following year the couple occupied this address most likely after retiring from the farm. By 1954, Elsie was the sole occupant of the house after her husband's death. She continued here until at least the early 1960s.


