7. Description

This 1½-story single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1946 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built during and after World War II. Albert Lynch died in 1946 so it is possible the house was built a year or two before then.

The Lynch House is an example of a vernacular 1½-story Minimal Traditional house form. The house has a poured concrete foundation with narrow clapboard-style vinyl siding on the frame walls. The house has a moderate-to-steeply pitched side-gable roof with no eaves and two gable-roof attic dormers along the front slope. A 1½-storyside-gable wing is at the south end with its own attic dormer. An enclosed entrance bay centered on the main block has a front gable roof with the door centered between tall multi-light sidelights. A small 1-story side gabled addition is setback along the south façade. The rear roof sloop has a shed-roof dormer that looks out over the entrance drive to the partially sub-surface attached 2-bay garage. Fenestration includes 2/2 double-hung windows with horizontal lights. The lower level primarily has paired windows with single units on the upper level and in the dormers.

Alterations: siding (undated).

8. Significance

The house at 213 3rd Street SE is an example of a vernacular 1½-story Minimal Traditional house form from the post-World War II period. It is typical of houses built as in-fill housing during this period. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criterion C.

According to newspaper accounts, Waverly began a construction boom at the end of the 1940s that continued into the next decade. In 1950 alone, at least 22 homes were under construction in town. A homebuilding boom such as this was considered an indication that population was heading up. The federal census figures show Waverly's population rising from 4,156 in 1940 to 5,124 or nearly 25% in the decade.

This house was erected on a section of the William and Alizina Harmon House property at 225 3rd Street SE. Albert and Anna Lynch built it while their son and daughter-in-law, Esther and Les Lynch resided in the Harmon House. Al Lynch died soon after the house was completed.




