#### 7. Description

This 2-story single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1933 according to Bremer County Assessor records. This date is confirmed by a series of newspaper accounts published that year. Architectural drawings for the house are retained by the current owner but are undated.

This brick house is an example of a Mission Style house built using the Front-Gable-and-Wing form. In this example the side gable section has a front-gable wing. The house has a poured concrete foundation with mottled tan and brown-colored brick walls. Brick ornamentation includes multi-colored rock-faced brick quoins around the French doors and similar colored soldier brick arches for the larger window openings. The house has a low-pitched intersecting-gable roof with narrow eaves. The roof is clad in terra cotta red clay tiles and decorative ridge tile. The main entrance is tucked in the right-hand ell set beneath a small tile-clad shed roof supported by knee brace brackets. A similar door hood is used for the rear entrance. The house incorporates a single-bay garage into the basement level with the overhead door opening onto the alley to the south. Another unusual Mission Style feature of the house is the chimney top for the exposed chimney on the north façade. It features a tiled roof cap with three side openings.

Fenestration is the most important design element for the Gruben House. The feature window of the front façade is in the end wall of the front-gable wing. It has a segmental brick arch above a group of four multi-lights windows with shaped multi-light transoms. Similar 10-light units in fixed and double-hung configurations are elsewhere on the main floor. Elsewhere windows include 6/1, 8/1, and 9/1 double-hung units in various sizes. Several semi-circular arched sashes, including a pair of multi-light windows at the front entrance, reflect the favorite window shape of the Mission Style. Semi-circular arched vents are in the gable ends of the attic levels. Feature entrance openings incorporate multi-light French doors including a pair along the south façade of the front wing, and a pair for the wrought iron balcony on the second floor on the north façade.

The interior of the house is influenced by the Mission Style design of the building exterior as well. Examples include the segmental arched curved openings between rooms, the sets of circular landings and curved steps connecting levels of the house, and the wrought iron balustrade separating the main floor from the sunken living room. Another interesting feature is the carved stone for part of the mantel and fireplace surround. It depicts a cabin scene setting in the north woods that recalls the Gruben family's cabin in Northern Minnesota.

As noted above, the house has a single-stall garage bay in the exposed basement level. It opens onto the alley and is original to the house. The overhead door design includes six square windows over three paneled rows. According to the drawings for the elevations of the house, this door is close in design to the original planned door.

#### 8. Significance

The house at 305 3<sup>rd</sup> Street SE is a well-preserved example of a Mission Style house form built during the Depression Era. It is a rare example of this style in Waverly. It is also associated with the career of Merle Gruben, who operated the family monument works in Waverly for more than 50 years while he and his wife Jeanette resided here. Both his father and brother resided within a block of Merle's residence. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places individually under Criterion C and as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criteria A and C.

Merle Gruben was the son of Matthew Gruben, a German immigrant and stonecutter, who settled in Waverly in 1890. He worked for the Waverly Granite and Marble Works and later became partner and then owner in the business. In 1909 Matt and his wife Mary built a new house at 220 4<sup>th</sup> Street SE were they raised their two sons, Merle and Harold C. Both brothers eventually built houses near their parents – Merle at 305 3<sup>rd</sup> Street SE (1933) and Harold at 402 3<sup>rd</sup> Street SE (1924). A biography of Matt Gruben compiled in 1914 appears below:

#### MATT GRUBEN

Business interests of Waverly find a progressive and worthy representative in Matt Gruben, operating the Waverly Granite and Marble Works, the oldest establishment of its kind in northern Iowa. He was born in Prussia, Germany, June 22, 1871, and is a son of Nicolao and Katherine (Hammes) Gruben, both of whom were born in the same locality. The father engaged in farming there for many years and never came to America. He had been twice married and had four children by his first wife and two by his second. After his death the mother of the subject of this review came to America and settled in Hastings, Minnesota, in 1882. She moved from that city to Mankato, in the same state, and there she still resides.

Matt Gruben acquired his education in the public schools of Minnesota and after laying aside his books, began learning the stonecutter's trade in Hastings, continuing at it in Mankato. In 1890 he came to Waverly and worked in the employ of A.R. Taylor for some years, eventually buying a half interest in the business. In 1900 he purchased the entire concern and moved it from the original location on West Bremer street [sic] to the new plant one block east. There he has one of the most modern and up-to-date shops in lowa, provided with a show-room eighty feet deep and an enclosed work shop twenty-two feet square. The Waverly Granite and Marble Works is the oldest establishment of its kind in northern lowa and is without doubt one of the best equipped, electric power and pneumatic tools being used for producing finer work than can be done by hand. Mr. Gruben has also installed an overhead traveling crane of the latest pattern and this has proved of the greatest value in moving monuments. He keeps on hand a large and well assorted stock of artistic marble and granite of all kinds and he makes it his aim to keep his prices reasonable and his work of the highest quality. In addition to the work done and his shop he also imports monuments from all over the world, especially from Scotland and Sweden, and his business is continually growing in volume and importance.

On the 19th of June, 1895, Mr. Gruben married Miss Mary E. Runyard, a daughter of Austin Runyard, a representative of one of the best known families in Bremer county. She is a highly educated woman and was for some time principal in the city schools. Mr. and Mrs. Gruben have two children, Merrill F. and Harold C., who are attending school. Mr. Gruben is a member of the Roman Catholic church and he gives his political allegiance to the republican party. The cause of education finds in him a loyal supporter. His attention is concentrated upon the upbuilding of his marble and monument works and in the development of this business he has proved capable, reliable and energetic, standing today among the men of marked ability and substantial worth in this locality. By the time that Merle Gruben was managing the monument company the firm name had been changed to Gruben Monument Works but was still located on West Bremer Avenue. The Grubens owned the house until 1989 selling it to John Hussin. He held it for four years selling it in 1993 to Timothy and Angela Kilworth. The couple worked as engineers for John Deere. In 2008 the property was sold to Steven and Sara Dobbs. Sara's father, Ronald Matthias, occupies the house in 2011. He is a retired Wartburg College professor and administrator as well as an author.








