

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7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1898 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with similar houses in Waverly built using this form from ca. 1910 to 1925. Property Transfer Records show all of Lot 1 sold to Margaret A. Ellsworth in August 1901 but not recorded until December 1909. By 1913, city directory listings show three houses on the lot still held by Mrs. Ellsworth. Newspaper accounts record her building two houses in the 4th Ward in 1911. She resided in one of the houses, which was located at 310 3rd St. SE, and the other two were held as rental properties. The house at 308 was occupied by Carl and Lydia Reith who acquired the house from Mrs. Ellsworth in 1920.

This house is an example of a Bungalow Style 2-story house form. The house has rock-faced concrete block for the foundation with a smooth finished block with beveled edges set as quoins at the corners. The use of block rather than stone confirms a post-1900 construction date. The walls are clad in medium-width clapboard-style vinyl siding. The house has a side-gabled roof with an extended slope on the front forming a recessed porch. A shed-roofed dormer is centered on the front slope. The original porch design likely had block pedestals and half-height columns or piers at the outer corners and adjacent to entrance steps. Now the porch deck has been replaced with a concrete slab and square wood porch posts replace the pedestals and columns or piers. Entrance steps are set beneath the porch ceiling with a wrought iron balustrade used for the landing and to line the. The Reith House is the middle house on the right shows the development of Lot 1 by the time the 1927 Sanborn Map was published



Fenestration in the house includes a mix of original and replacement windows. On the front, first floor, a cottage window with a framed pediment lintel (likely not an original shape for the lintel) is to the right of the front door. On the left a pair of 4/1 double-hung windows are in place. The upper level dormer has a group of three windows with a 1/1 double-hung sash flanked by narrow 1/1 units. On the north façade, an unusual window group includes a 4/1 window flanked by narrow 3-light sash the height of the upper sash of the middle unit. Elsewhere on the house has single and paired 1/1 units of various sizes.

The house has a detached frame garage that pre-dates the 1927 Sanborn Map. It has a single bay, hip roof, medium width beveled wood siding, corner board trim, and exposed rafter tails. The overhead tilt-up garage door consists of tongue-and-groove boards.

Alterations: Vinyl siding (undated); porch alterations (undated); selected window changes (undated).

8. Significance

The Reith House at 308 3rd St SE was built in ca. 1911 and is an example of a Bungalow Style 2-story house form. By 1913, it was one of three houses built on Lot 1 in Block 16 owned by Margaret A.

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Ellsworth. Though the house has suffered some loss of integrity the basic forms remain intact. It is likely that the original clapboard siding survives beneath vinyl siding. This house and the other two undertaken by Maggie Ellsworth are examples of dense residential development in the neighborhood and provide evidence of how widows made their way by owning, developing, and leasing houses and apartments. The house and garage qualify for the National Register of Historic Places as contributing resources in the historic district under Criteria A and C.

The owner-builder of the Reith House was Margaret A. (Hill) Ellsworth, widow of Gorham E. Ellsworth. The couple married on May 11, 1868 in Bremer County, and Gorham died seven years later. Maggie was left to raise her family of three children. On August 27, 1901, Maggie purchased Lot 1 in Block 16 and by 1913 was listed as residing in one of three houses on the lot, a small house at the far south end of the property at 310 3rd Street SE. It is likely that she held the other two houses including the Reith House at 308 3rd St. SE and the house at 220 2nd Ave SE as rental properties. The 1912 city directory lists 308 3rd St. SE as occupied by Carl H. Reith and his wife Lydia. Carl was a partner in the business "Reith & Clark," a barbershop, pool hall and lunch room, located at 108 E. Bremer Ave.

Maggie Ellsworth continued to own Lot 1 until she sold two halves of the lot in 1920. The south 78 feet was sold to Lydia Reith. This parcel held not only the Reith House but Maggie's personal residence at 310 3rd Street SE.


