

7. Description

This 2-story single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1904 according to Bremer County Assessor records. Property transfer records show the property acquired by Frances Schlutsmeyer in 1889 from W.M. Woodford as part of a four lot parcel – Lots 5,6,7,& 8. In April 1906, the strip of land across the north of Lots 5, 6 and 7 was sold for the construction of a house by Henry and Carrie Luhring. Newspaper accounts from April through August1906 reference Henry Luhring's construction of a house in the 4th Ward with the last story in August 1906 mentioning "moving in." Together, this information confirms a likely date of construction of 1906. This date is further confirmed by the 1913 city directory that listed the Luhring family living at 317 S. Harmon Street (3rd St. SE).

This 2-story frame house is an example of a vernacular Gambrel Cottage with Colonial Revival detailing. It has a moderate pitched gambrel roof with the gambrel end facing the street lined by returning cornices and narrow eaves. Gambrel roofed wall dormers are centered on the north and south facades. A flat-roof enclosed porch spans the front façade with a pediment over the offset entrance. It was originally an open porch as depicted in the 1927 Sanborn Map (right).



The Luhring House has a rock-faced concrete block foundation with narrow-width wood clapboard for the first and second levels, a simple belt course separating the attic level, and corner board trim. The gambrel peak-attic level is clad in square-cut wood shingles. The same treatment appears in the dormers except there is no belt course present. The porch has been enclosed with plywood panels and the skirting panels have removed. The tympanum of the pediment above the entrance is clad in tongue-and-groove boards.

Fenestration includes various sized 1/1 double-hung windows. Widely spaced windows are in each of the gambrel ends with a semi-circular keystoned opening also in the larger peak of the front façade. The window sash is boarded over in this unit. In the wall dormers, the belt courses also serve as window lintels. On the lower level, south façade a shallow rectilinear window bay features a group of three tall and narrow 1/1 units. On the north façade, a single-light horizontal window is above the basement entrance. The front porch has large 1/1 windows flanking the entrance.

The house has a detached 1-story double-bay garage located east of the house and accessed from the east-west alley. Built in 1977 according to Bremer County Assessor records, it has a low-pitched front-gable roof with medium-width wood clapboard siding and a wood paneled overhead door. The entrance bay opens to the north.

Alterations: porch enclosed (post-1927); garage built (1977); gambrel peak window closed (undated).

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8. Significance

The Luhring House is an example of a vernacular Gambrel Cottage with Colonial Revival detailing. The house was part of the main wave of homebuilding in the neighborhood that extended from the 1880s through World War I. Its owners, Henry Luhring and his wife Carrie (Caroline), built the house in 1906. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource in the historic district under Criteria A and C. The garage is considered noncontributing.

According to property transfer records, Henry F. Luhring and his wife Carrie acquired a parcel consisting of a strip of land extending across the north edge of Lots 5, 6 and 7 in Block 15 in April 1906. Newspaper accounts from April through August1906 reference Henry Luhring's construction of a house in the 4th Ward with the last story in August 1906 mentioning the family "moving in." According to Sanborn Maps from 1927, the parcel originally contained a 2-story barn (nonextant) on Lot 7 no longer apart of the parcel.

Henry F. Luhring was a partner with H.K. Paper in a hardware store located at 203 E. Bremer that operated as "Luhring & Pape Hardware Company." The business advertised expertise in heating, plumbing, and tinning as well as hardware sales. The hardware business was one of three hardware firms in Waverly in 1913. In 1919, the Luhrings sold the house to Christina Chittenden, wife of Daniel A. Chittenden. Both the 1926 and 1931 telephone directories show the address occupied by D.A. Chittenden. Earlier Bremer County atlas records suggest that that Daniel was may have been a descendent of a farming family and as a result, he may have been a retired farmer himself by the time the couple resided here.



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


