

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7. Description

This 2-story single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1894 according to Bremer County Assessor records. Newspaper accounts, however, suggest a 1-story house was in place when Sophia Schoof acquired the property in 1890 from Wm. H. Jay. The outline of this building appears on the 1894 Bremer County Atlas with no indication of the number of stories. Newspaper accounts record a building in place when the transfer took place in 1890 and that a second story valued at \$600 was added by Schoof to all or part of the house in August 1900. The Schoof family resided at this address in the 1899 and 1913 city directories. The design of the house was used in lowa from the 1870s to the 1920s. Together, this information strongly suggests a construction date of ca. 1890 or slightly earlier for the original building rather than 1894.

This 2-story brick-veneer house is an example of a vernacular Gable-Front-and-Wing house form. It has T-plan for the original building and since ca. 1900, has had a 2-story form with a moderate pitched intersecting gable roof. The house has narrow eaves with no cornice and no dormers. An enclosed flat-roof porch fills the right-hand ell. As originally built, the house had medium-width wood clapboard siding. This continued in place until sometime after the 1943 update of the 1927 Sanborn Map. The house is depicted in that map at right.



The Jay-Schoof House has a stone foundation with multi-colored brick veneer for wall cladding. The same cladding is used for the lower walls of the enclosed porch and the 1-story rear addition. Fenestration includes various sized 1/1 double-hung windows widely spaced on the walls. The porch has a continuous row of 1/1 units to either side of the front door. The addition of brick veneer and the enclosure of the porch are major changes to the house diminishing its significance under Criterion C.

The property retains its original 2-story detached frame barn located north of the house. No date is provided for the barn's construction in Bremer County Assessor records. The barn has a side-gable form with wide beveled wood siding and corner board trim (some pieces missing). The original wagon doors appear to be in place left of center on the west façade. They include two doors, one double-wide in width making the opening very wide for large loads. A single hay mow door is centered above the wagon door opening. A shed-roofed single bay garage addition is at the south end of the barn. It has a wood and glass panel overhead door facing west. According to local accounts, John Schoof was known for building barns in Bremer County and Waverly. It is likely that Schoof participated in the design and construction of this barn elevating its significance.

Alterations: veneer brick on house (undated); porch enclosure (undated); garage addition to barn (undated).

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8. Significance

The Jay-Schoof House is an example of a vernacular Gable-Front-and-Wing house form. The house was part of the main wave of homebuilding in the neighborhood that extended from the 1880s through World War I. Its first owners, William H. and Jane Jay resided here from the time the house was built as a one-story residence in ca. 1880 until William's death in 1882. The owners beginning in 1890 were John Schoof, a carpenter, and his wife, Sophie. The house has seen several alterations including a historic change in 1900 when a second story was added and a more recent undated change that resulted in the house receiving brick veneer cladding. As a result of the latter change, the house is considered a noncontributing resource in terms of National Register of Historic Places for the historic district in which it is located. Construction of the barn is attributed to John Schoof, and as a result, is considered contributing.

According to property transfer records, the William H. Jay family acquired this property in April 1868. They likely built a 1-story house on this site during the next decade. In 1882 William died but the family held onto the property until 1890 when it was transferred to Sophie Schoof, wife of John Schoof. The July 24, 1890 addition of the *Waverly Republican* documents the purchase noting the house already on the property acquired. The 1894 Bremer County Atlas shows the outline of this house without the rear addition and an undated historic photograph shows the building with the second floor addition sometime after 1900 when the *Waverly Democrat* reported that Schoof was adding a story to his Fourth Ward house. Later that year, the construction project was valued at \$600 (December 27, 1900 year end summary of construction). In 1924, John died but Sophie continued to live here for a time. She died in 1946 and both were buried in Harlington Cemetery.

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


