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7. Description

This 1-story single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1958 according to Bremer County Assessor records. Telephone and city directories confirm this date. The house form and style are consistent with houses in Waverly built during the mid to late-1950s.

This frame house is an example of a vernacular 1-story Ranch/Rambler house form. This variation has a detached garage set to the rear of the lot and a narrow width that makes this house's footprint suitably sized for this lot. The foot print is rectangular with a cut-away section on the northwest corner providing access to the north-facing entrance. The house has a concrete block foundation, wide clapboard-style vinyl siding, and reddish-brown Roman brick veneer topped by a narrow limestone belt course for the lower walls that wrap the front façade and north and south corners. The house has a broad, low-pitched front-gable roof with shallow eaves on the gable ends and wide eaves along the slopes. Along the north façade and towards the front of the house to provide overhead protection along the access walk way. A short brick wall and planter surrounds the entrance steps and landing with a decorative wrought iron post at the outer corner supporting the entrance roof.

Fenestration includes a group of five single-light casement and fixed sash centered on the front façade. A mix of single-light casements and various sized 1/1 double-hung windows appear along the south façade where a second entrance opens onto the driveway. The house has a free-standing frame garage with a low-pitched front-gable roof, no eaves on the gabled ends and narrows eaves along the slopes. It is clad in matching wide clapboard-style vinyl siding. The garage was also built in 1958 according to the County Assessor's records. The overhead door is on the west end and is a replacement.

Alterations: vinyl siding (undated).

8. <u>Significance</u>

The Fern Scully House at 427 3rd Street SE is an example of a vernacular 1-story Ranch/Rambler house form from final development phase of the post-World War II period. It is typical of the handful of houses built as in-fill housing during this period. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criterion C.

According to newspaper accounts from the 1950s, Waverly was experiencing a construction boom during the decade that included more than \$10 million of work in the first decade after the war. The construction was considered an indication that population was continuing to head up. The federal census figures show Waverly's population rising 25% during the decade of the 1940s and continuing up from 5,124 in 1950 to 6,357 in 1960 or 24% in the following decade. Construction of infill housing in the neighborhood north of the Cedar River such as this house accompanied additional growth across the river to the south.

Fern Scully, a widow, was listed as moving to this address according to telephone and city directories between 1957 and 1959. She was a widow with no occupation at the time.

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
