#### 7. Description

This single-family house is estimated to have been built in 1875 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The house form and style are consistent with similar houses in Waverly built using this form from the end of the Civil War through the turn of the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. In 1876 Property Transfer Records show the lot sold by J.H. Bowman to St. Andrew's Parish. It remained in use as the parish rectory until ca. 1894 when Eliza J. Laird bought the house. By 1912 she resided here.

St. Andrews's Episcopal Rectory-Eliza Laird House is an example of a vernacular Gable Front and Wing, 2-story house form built using Italianate Style features. The house has a parged stone foundation with medium-width clapboard-style aluminum siding. The house has T-shaped plan with an intersecting gable roof with narrow eaves, returning cornices and two porches – a small hipped roof porch facing 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue and a wraparound porch tucked in the right hand ell at the southeast corner.

The wraparound porch has a low-pitched hipped roof supported by six full-height, evenly spaced smooth columns. The balustrade has turned spindles and the skirting has a diagonal lattice pattern. The second porch facing 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue on the front-gable end, also has a low-pitched hipped roof, square posts at the corners, a balustrade with turned spindles, and screen panels and a screen door. The skirting has a diagonal lattice pattern.

Fenestration in the house includes tall and narrow 1/1 double-hung windows and smaller 1/1 windows. The window openings retain their pediment designs throughout the house and a flat roofed angular bay window remains on the east facade. It is likely that given the age of the house, the windows originally may have had 2/2 sash that have subsequently been replaced.

Two detached frame garages are at the rear of the property opening onto the east-west alley. Assessor records date the garages to 1875 and 1920, however, it is more likely that both were erected in the early to mid-20<sup>th</sup> century. The garage closest to 3<sup>rd</sup> Street SE likely pre-dates 1927 when it appears on the Sanborn Map published that year. It has a moderate-pitched front-gable roof, beveled wood siding, corner board trim, a replacement overhead door, and 4-light fixed sash along the side walls. The newer garage set further west was built after 1927. It has a low-pitched front-gable roof, beveled wood siding, corner board trim, a replacement overhead door facing east, and a slightly wider footprint. It was likely constructed in the 1950s.

Alterations: aluminum siding (undated); second garage added (undated); conversion from single-family to two-family residence (undated).

#### 8. Significance

St. Andrews's Episcopal Rectory at 219 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue SE built in ca. 1876 is an example of an Italianate influenced Gable Front and Wing, 2-story house. By 1894 it was owned by Eliza J. Laird and her husband Nathaniel. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criterion C. The garage closest to 3<sup>rd</sup> Street SE is contributing and the second garage is considered noncontributing.

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St. Andrew's Episcopal Rectory was built in 1876 as a parsonage for St. Andrews's Episcopal Church (nonextant), which stood nearby at the southwest corner of 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue SE and 3<sup>rd</sup> Street SE. The property for the rectory was purchased on May 6, 1876 from J.H. Bowman. It was held by the parish until March 22, 1894 when it was sold to Eliza Jane Laird. At the time she was the wife of Nathaniel Laird. The Lairds had settled on a farm in Warren Township sometime prior to 1870 with their family of four children and by 1870 had a fifth child. Nathaniel was a native of Ireland and Eliza was born in Pennsylvania. The couple resided in Illinois prior to moving to Bremer County.

A newspaper account from the *Waverly Republican* in 1894 stated that "Mrs. E.J. Laird has purchased from St. Andrew's Parish the house and lot on Washington Street [3<sup>rd</sup> Street SE] known as the Episcopal rectory, paying \$3,300 for the same. It is a desirable property. Mrs. Laird will probably eventually make it her home." In 1898 Nathaniel Laid died. Sometime between publication of the 1899 and 1912 city directories, Mrs. Laird moved into the former rectory. Emma Laird, a teacher, resided here with her mother in 1912.


