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

7. Description

This house is estimated to have been built in 1913 according to Bremer County Assessor records. The design of the house is consistent with the date. Historical accounts indicate that St. Mary's Catholic Church (nonextant) was erected on the lot to the east in 1912-1913 and that the parochial residence was completed in 1917. This date is consistent with the design of the house.

St. Mary's Rectory is an example of a Hipped-Roof, 2-Story house form originally built as a rectory for the priest of St. Mary's Catholic Church. The house has low-pitched hipped roof with wide eaves and no dormers. As originally constructed, the house sat immediately west of St. Mary's Catholic Church (nonextant). In the 1927 Sanborn Map (right), the house had an open front porch and 2-story rear sleeping porch. Both are now enclosed. The lowpitched hipped roof garage has tile block walls and a narrow breeze-way connecting it to the house. The garage was constructed sometime after 1927.



The former rectory has a low concrete block foundation with mottled reddish brown brick walls and a narrow limestone belt course located at a raised height giving the building a taller first floor than second floor. The belt course and low-pitched roof provide a Prairie School Style influence for this building.

A low-pitched hipped roof porch spans the front of the building. Like the house, the porch has wide eaves, tall brick pedestals with geometric pattern brick work and stone sills. The porch has now been enclosed with wide clapboard siding and double-hung windows with the siding extending to the ground level.

Fenestration includes a mix of double-hung window sizes and configurations. Single and paired 9/1 units with taller lower sash are located on the front and side elevations. On the front, one pair has been replaced by a single-light fixed sash. Other windows include 16/1 and 6/1 double hung windows and a horizontal 12-light sash on the west side above the breezeway. Sometime after 1927, a double-bay garage was added on the west side of the house. It has a low-pitched hipped roof and is constructed of dark reddish brown tile block. A narrow breezeway constructed of the same material connects the house to the garage. It is lined by a group of three 1/1 windows on both the north and south walls.

Alterations: garage (post-1927); porch enclosure(undated); removal of window pair, front facade (undated); conversion to apartments (undated).

8. Significance

St. Mary's Catholic Church Rectory at 112 2nd Avenue SE is an example of a Prairie School Style influenced American Four-Square house form dating from ca. 1917. It was built for Father Dennis Lundon, priest at St. Mary's Catholic Church at the time. The rectory was built during main period of homebuilding in the neighborhood between 1880 and World War I. The house qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing resource to the historic district under Criterion C and the garage is also considered contributing.

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St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church was established by German Catholics in Waverly before the Civil War with a church located on "Catholic Hill" in northeast Waverly. After the turn of the 20th century, members sought a location closer to the center of town and in 1912-1913 built a Romanesque Revival Style brick church at 120 2nd Avenue SE. In June 1912, under Father Denis Lundon, plans for the new church began. Specifications for the church, Romanesque in style, were reportedly prepared by Emmanuel Masqueray, a prominent French-trained architect who practiced in New York City and St. Louis prior to moving to St. Paul, Minnesota. He practiced here from 1905 until his death in 1917. The new church in Waverly was dedicated on Nov. 16, 1913. Other important works by Masqueray included the Cathedral of Saint Paul in Saint Paul and the Basilica of Saint Mary in Minneapolis. It is possible that Masqueray also designed the St. Mary's Rectory prior to his death.

St. Mary's Catholic Church was razed in 2009 but the former rectory remains as rental unit.


