#### 7. Description

The Myron and Josephine Chambers House at 514 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue SW is estimated by the Bremer County Assessor to have been constructed in 1894. This date is consistent with the building's form and design but not the material used as cement or concrete block was not a local building material until the first decade of the 20<sup>th</sup> century when several local block manufacturers produced the block and formed construction companies promoting the material's used. The 1913 city directory lists the house as in place at that time.

The Chambers House is an example of a vernacular Pyramidal or Hipped Roof, 1-Story residential form that was built in Iowa from the 1890s through the 1920s. The house has a rock faced concrete block foundation and walls. This material is typical of concrete block produced by George E. Blain who had a block manufacturing company in northwest Waverly. The basic rusticated block that Blain produced evolved over time in terms of standard size and finish. The earliest block had a dimpled texture with beveled edges; later block employed rustic rock-faced finishes. Occasionally, Blain produced variations in the color of concrete parts to draw attention to their installation. Quoins were one such example. This material change was likely used for the quoining surrounding the entrance on this house no longer visible because of the painted finish. George Blain's company built houses in the northwest quadrant as well as other parts of town.

The Chamabers House has a moderate pitched pyramidal roof with wide eaves and a single attic dormer on the front slope with one single-light window. A cutaway or recessed porch spans the front with a concrete block foundation, concrete slab deck, and four block pedestals along the front edge. Four half-height concrete columns with horizontal markings rest on the pedestals and support the porch roof. The house appears to be deceptively small with the 1-story footprint measuring 28 feet wide by 34 feet deep for a total of 952 square feet. The building's original finish would have been unpainted concrete block but in 2010, a multi-color paint scheme has given the building more elaborate detailing than is actually there by the use of a darker paint color for the foundation block and a medium paint color for vertical columns of blocks at the corners and on the sides of the entrance suggesting visual quoins.

Fenestration includes 1/1 double-hung windows of various sizes set beneath cast stone lintels. The front door is offset to the right with a larger 1/1 window to the right and a narrower unit to the left. On the sides windows are widely spaced singles or pairs. The house has a single-bay detached frame garage built in 2005.

#### 8. Significance

The Chambers House at 514 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue SW derives significances under Criterion C as an example of a vernacular Pyramidal or Hipped Roof, 1-Story residential form from the pre-World War I years. The building's early use of concrete block for the foundation, walls and porch elements including concrete columns as well as its high level of integrity add to the building's significance. The recently constructed garage is considered noncontributing.

#### Historical Background for Waverly<sup>1</sup>

Waverly was established in 1853 along the Cedar River in Waverly Township located in southeastern Bremer County. It was designated as the county seat for Bremer County the same year that the county was officially organized and was formally incorporated in 1859. Like most lowa towns established before the Civil War, growth during the early 1860s was deferred until after the war came to a close. Waverly's first railroad, the Cedar Falls and Minnesota Railroad was extended to Waverly in 1864. Eventually track was also laid for other branch lines and an electric interurban. By 1917 track for branch lines was absorbed by the Chicago and Great Western Railroad and the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railroad. Track for the electric interurban – the Waterloo, Cedar Falls, and Northern – was laid in 1910 but usage was never as substantial as predicted.

Waverly grew in the manner typical of other lowa county seats in the late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century. Its commercial center extended along the east-west route of Bremer Avenue on both sides of the Bremer Avenue Bridge that crossed the L-shaped course of the Cedar River as it passed through the center of town. The county courthouse was located outside of the commercial area on a slight prominence at the east end of Bremer Avenue. Residential districts grew up in the four quadrants formed by the intersecting main street and river. The broad, generally flat profile of both the business district and early residential neighborhoods saw the regular occurrence of flooding resulting in the gradual replacement of most first generation frame building stock. German immigrants were among the largest ethnic group to populate Waverly during the 19<sup>th</sup> century establishing religious institutions with ethnic affiliations such as St. Paul's Lutheran Church in the northwest quadrant, St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church in southeast quadrant, and the German Methodist Church.

Bremer County and its county seat of Waverly prospered during the late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century becoming a retail and professional services center for Bremer County and sections of adjacent Butler County. The county's standing as the "Dairy Spot of Iowa," gave rise to a number of dairy industries including a manufacturing plant operated by the Carnation Milk Products Company for the production of condensed milk in the 1920s. Population stood at 16,300 people in 1900 before the growth rate slowed before World War I. By 1930 population topped 17,000. Expansion of a Lutheran seminary in Waverly first located in the community in 1879 through the relocation of Wartburg College to the community in 1939 was a cultural and economic stimulus for the community. Waverly continued to add a 1,000 people per decade until 1950 when the post-War boom saw growth accelerate to more than 21,000 by 1960. During the past 50 years population has slowed somewhat topping out at 23,325 in 2000.

Historical Background for the Chambers House at 514 5th Avenue SW

The Chambers House at 514 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue SW is estimated to have been constructed in 1894 according to the Bremer County Assessor's records. This date is consistent with the architectural style and form but too early by 10 to 15 years for the rock faced concrete block used for construction. The W.W. Smith Addition was laid out in 1892 by William Ward Smith southwest of the Wm. Sturdevant Addition to the north and the I.R. Sturdevant Addition to the east, both laid out four decades earlier in the mid-1800s. Houses in the W.W. Smith Addition were constructed from ca. 1890 through the 1950s making the construction of this house in ca. 1910




