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### 7. Description

The Adolph and Dora Kaufmann House at 323 2<sup>nd</sup> St SW is estimated to have been constructed in 1925 according to the Bremer County Assessor's records. The house design and the stone foundation pre-date 1905 for domestic buildings in Waverly. Property Transfer Records show this parcel owned by Adolph Kaufmann from 4/17/1886 to 4/17/1897. The 1895 lowa Census shows Adolph, his wife Dora, and their four children residing in the Third Ward and a newspaper account identifies a house occupied by Adolph on Elm Street in 1895. This public information confirms a more likely construction completion date of ca. 1895 rather than the Assessor estimate of 1925.

The house is an example of a vernacular Hipped Roof, 2-Story house form commonly built in central lowa sometime during the 1880s and the 1890s. The building has a stone block foundation typically used for pre-1905 houses in Waverly with narrow-width clapboard-style vinyl siding and corner board trim covering the original wood clapboard walls. It has a low-pitched hipped roof with no dormers and a flattened peak, also typical of pre-1900 houses with hipped roofs. The original porch delineated by the molding set between levels has been replaced with a small entrance stoop with turned roof posts. A 1-story addition wraps the rear of the house.

Fenestration includes widely spaced single and paired 1/1 double-hung windows on the upper level and both side faces. The first floor front façade windows a replacement fixed sashes with 15 lights. Other modifications include installation of a double-width exposed chimney on the south façade now clad in synthetic siding. The property has a double-bay detached garage with a low-pitched side-gable roof and twin overhead doors. Built in 2001, the garage is clad in matching vinyl siding. It faces 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave SW. The garage is considered noncontributing.

#### 8. Significance

The Adolph and Dora Kaufmann House at 323 2<sup>nd</sup> St SW is significant as a contributing resource in the Sturdevant SW Historic District under both Criteria A and C as well. The historic district qualifies for the National Register of Historic Places as a well-preserved collection of mid and late 19<sup>th</sup> century and early 20<sup>th</sup> century architectural styles and vernacular house forms located in Waverly's southwest residential neighborhood. The neighborhood developed as a middle class and working class residential district from the late 1850s through the mid-20<sup>th</sup> century. The garage is considered noncontributing.

### Historical Background for Waverly<sup>1</sup>

Waverly was established in 1853 along the Cedar River in Waverly Township located in southeastern Bremer County. It was designated as the county seat for Bremer County the same year that the county was officially organized and was formally incorporated in 1859. Like most lowa towns established before the Civil War, growth during the early 1860s was deferred until after the war came to a close. Waverly's first railroad, the Cedar Falls and Minnesota Railroad was extended to Waverly in 1864. Eventually track was also laid for other branch lines and an electric interurban. By 1917 track for branch lines was absorbed by the Chicago and

Great Western Railroad and the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railroad. Track for the electric interurban – the Waterloo, Cedar Falls, and Northern – was laid in 1910 but usage was never as substantial as predicted.

Waverly grew in the manner typical of other lowa county seats in the late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century. Its commercial center extended along the east-west route of Bremer Avenue on both sides of the Bremer Avenue Bridge that crossed the L-shaped course of the Cedar River as it passed through the center of town. The county courthouse was located outside of the commercial area on a slight prominence at the east end of Bremer Avenue. Residential districts grew up in the four quadrants formed by the intersecting main street and river. The broad, generally flat profile of both the business district and early residential neighborhoods saw the regular occurrence of flooding resulting in the gradual replacement of most first generation frame building stock. German immigrants were among the largest ethnic group to populate Waverly during the 19<sup>th</sup> century establishing religious institutions with ethnic affiliations such as St. Paul's Lutheran Church in the northwest quadrant, St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church in southeast quadrant, and the German Methodist Church.

Bremer County and its county seat of Waverly prospered during the late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century becoming a retail and professional services center for Bremer County and sections of adjacent Butler County. The county's standing as the "Dairy Spot of Iowa," gave rise to a number of dairy industries including a manufacturing plant operated by the Carnation Milk Products Company for the production of condensed milk in the 1920s. Population stood at 16,300 people in 1900 before the growth rate slowed before World War I. By 1930 population topped 17,000. Expansion of a Lutheran seminary in Waverly first located in the community in 1879 through the relocation of Wartburg College to the community in 1939 was a cultural and economic stimulus for the community. Waverly continued to add a 1,000 people per decade until 1950 when the post-War boom saw growth accelerate to more than 21,000 by 1960. During the past 50 years population has slowed somewhat topping out at 23,325 in 2000.

Historical Background for the Adolph and Dora Kaufmann House at 323 2nd St SW

The Kaufmann House at 323 2<sup>nd</sup> St SW is located in Block 3 of the Wm. Sturdevant Addition. The southwest quadrant of Waverly includes additions platted by early Waverly settlers, Ira Sturdevant and his son William Sturdevant. The Sturdevant family moved to the unsettled area along the Cedar River in the mid-1850s. Ira received a 40-acre federal land grant based on his military service in the War of 1812. William acquired 80 acres of adjoining land to the north of his father's 40-acre parcel. In 1857 the William Sturdevant's Addition was laid out and in 1860 the Ira Sturdevant Addition was platted. Growth remained relatively slow in these subdivisions until after the Civil War.

The Kaufmann House was constructed sometime between the purchase of both Lots 7 and 8 by Adolph Kaufmann on 8/10/1886 and 4/17/1897 when the property was sold by Kaufmann. The 1895 lowa Census lists Kaufmann, a local druggist, residing in the Third Ward with his wife Dora and four children. The house passed through several short term owners and on 9/10/1910 it was acquired by Betsy Woodruff, a widow. She lived here until 1921. Subsequent owners/occupants included: Elizabeth Kingsberry (1921-1922); W.F. and Helen Masser (1922-1937); Elma Zastrow (1937-1942); W.S. and Mattie Lynes (1942-1948); E.C and Margaret Barnes (1948-1949); John and Marcia Meyer (1949-1960); Lewis and Elizabeth Miller (1960-1963); Donald and Carlene Stolt (1963-1976) with Larry and Sylvia Williams acquiring the house in 1976.

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
